**squeegee rollers**

**spool writer** The part of the System Support Program Product that prints output saved in the spool file.

**spot** A circular area on a printed sheet that is either darker or lighter than desired. See also background, gray bar.

**spot carbon** Paper from which carbon is omitted in certain areas to suppress printing of data on specified copies.

**spot punch** A device for punching one hole at a time in a data medium. (I) (A)

**SPPS** Subsystem Program Preparation Support.

**SPPS II** Subsystem Program Preparation Support II. An IBM program product that consists of programming languages, macroinstructions, and the 3275 terminal display language. SPPS II enables the user to write programs for execution in the programmable store system store controllers and programmable terminals. See Subsystem Program Preparation Support.

**SPR** System parameter record.

**spray tube** In a duplicator, a tube with suitably spaced holes used to apply a fine spray of fluid to the damping pad. (T)

**spread** Synonym for irrelevance.

**spreadsheet** A worksheet arranged in rows and columns, in which a change in the contents of one cell can cause electronic recomputation of one or more cells, based on user defined relations among the cells. (A)

**spreadsheet application** (1) A program that displays a worksheet in which a table of cells is arranged in rows and columns, and in which the change of the contents of one cell can cause recomputation of one or more cells based on user defined relations among the cells. (T) (2) Personal computer application software that allows a user to define mathematical or other logical relationships between columns and rows of cells and to determine the effect of a change in the value of one cell on the values in other cells on a trial-and-error basis. When a cell value is changed, the values of other affected cells are immediately recalculated.

**spreadsheet program** A program that displays a table of cells arranged in rows and columns, in which the change of the contents of one cell can cause recomputation of one or more cells based on user-defined relations among the cells. (T)

**spring-loaded pop-up** In the AIX operating system, a kind of widget, such as a menu, that is not visible to

the window manager. A spring-loaded pop-up disables user-event processing except for events that occur in the menu.

**sprite graphics** In multimedia applications, a small graphics picture, or series of pictures, that can be moved independently around the screen, producing animated effects.

**sprocket hole** Synonym for feed hole.

**sprocket track** Synonym for feed track.

**SPS** (1) Superscript character. (2) Sync point services.

**SPT** System parameter table.

**SPX circuit** Simplex circuit.

**SQA** System queue area.

**SQL** Structured query language.

**SQLCA** SQL communication area.

**SQL communication area (SQLCA)** In the AS/400 system, a set of variables that are used by SQL to provide an application program with information about the processing of SQL statements within the program.

**SQLDA** SQL descriptor area.

**SQL descriptor area (SQLDA)** In the AS/400 system, a set of variables that are used in the processing of certain SQL statements. The SQLDA is intended for dynamic SQL programs.

**SQL query** In AS/400 query management, a type of query that is created by running an IMPORT command against a file containing an SQL statement.

**square** On a calculator, the facility that directly multiplies a number by itself. (T)

**square function** The function that multiplies a number by itself directly. (T) (A)

**square root** On a calculator, the facility that directly provides a factor that, when multiplied by itself, produces the original number. (T)

**square root function** The function that directly provides a number that, when multiplied by itself, produces the original number. (T) (A)

**squeegee rollers** In a document copying machine, rollers through which the copy material is passed to remove surplus fluid following wet development. (T)
