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Plaintiff Finjan, Inc.'s ("Finjan") Administrative Motion to File Documents Under Seal was brought before this Court. Upon consideration of this motion and the supporting declaration of Hannah Lee filed in support of the motion, the Court finds there to be good cause and compelling reasons for granting the request to file certain documents under seal.

- 2. A substantial probability exists that the overriding confidentiality interests will be prejudiced if the record is not sealed;
 - 3. The proposed sealing is narrowly tailored; and
 - 4. No less restrictive means exist to achieve these overriding interests.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Finjan's Administrative Motion to File Documents Under Seal is GRANTED with respect to the documents set forth above. IT IS SO ORDERED.
