The foregoing, having been considered by the Court, is hereby:

ORDER:

Corrected Order. The court has received this morning, a package that does include a photo of a car that appears to have been in an accident, a picture of a document dated May 9, 2018 reflecting a Greenwich Police Case number (but no report); a picture of a document that appears to be written on a Greenwich Hospital prescription pad indicating that the plaintiff was admitted to the Greenwich Hospital on May 9 and remained in the hospital on May 10. The package was labeled for Judge Genuario's "eyes only". Nothing in the court's order #505 allowed such ex parte communication. If the plaintiff wishes to rely on this documentation he may provide it to opposing counsel and file it with the court consistent with the rules of practice. Of course, the plaintiff may redact personal identifying information as allowed by the practice book (though the court did not observe any such information on the documents provided). Moreover, there is still no diagnosis of the plaintiff's condition; no Greenwich Hospital intake assessment or discharge summary and no police report provided. Accordingly, the motion for continuance is denied without prejudice to the plaintiff's right to provide the court with a diagnosis, more formal Greenwich Hospital documentation as originally ordered, and a police report. Such additional documentation must be shared with opposing counsel, if the plaintiff wants the court to consider it.
