### Travel to Massachusetts

Beginning March 27, all travelers arriving to Massachusetts are instructed to self-quarantine for 14 days. This guidance will be displayed as posters at service plazas along 1-90 eastbound, distributed as flyers at major transportation hubs and on posted on highway message boards. Visitors are instructed not to travel to Massachusetts if they are displaying symptoms. Health care workers, public health workers, public safety workers, transportation workers and designated

On May 18, the Baker-Polito administration announced a data-driven plan to reopen travel in phases. For more information, view the Reopening MA Report on <a href="www.mass.gov/reopening">www.mass.gov/reopening</a> (/info-details/reopening-massachusetts). Massachusetts is currently in **Phase 1**:

- Safer-at-home advisory (/news/safer-at-home-advisory) in effect
- All travelers to MA urged to self quarantine for 14 days
- Lodging restricted to essential workers only

## International travel advisories

On March 16, due to ongoing community transmission of COVID-19 occurring globally, the <u>CDC</u> issued an updated Travel Health Alert (https://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/notices/alert/coronavirus-global) for all United States residents, instructing all travelers to stay home and monitor their health and practice social distancing for 14 days after returning to the US.

On March 19, the U.S. Department of State built upon their previous guidance and <u>issued an</u> <u>updated travel advisory</u>

(https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/traveladvisories/ea/travel-advisory-alert-global-level-3-health-advisory-issue.html), instructing all U.S. residents to avoid international travel, and advised residents currently abroad to prepare to shelter in place. Americans living abroad have also been advised to remain there.

On March 27, all travelers arriving to Massachusetts were instructed to self-quarantine for 14 days. In addition, visitors were instructed not to travel to Massachusetts if they are displaying symptoms. Health care workers, public health workers, public safety workers, transportation workers and designated essential workers are exempt from this requirement.
