Defendant INTERNATIONAL PAPER COMPANY, sued herein Individually and incorrectly as INTERNATIONAL PAPER COMPANY f/k/a Hammermill Paper Co and incorrectly as Successor to US Plywood, (hereinafter "INTERNATIONAL PAPER" or "Defendant") by its attorneys, Forman Watkins & Krutz LLP answers Plaintiff's Verified Complaint (hereinafter "Complaint") as follows:

#### THE PARTIES

To the extent that a response is required, INTERNATIONAL PAPER lacks sufficient information to admit or deny the allegations set forth in Paragraphs 6 through 41 of the Complaint and therefore, denies same.

**FIFTH:** INTERNATIONAL PAPER COMPANY admits that it was and still is a duly organized domestic corporation doing business in New York. Defendant denies the remaining allegations in Paragraph 42 of the Complaint. INTERNATIONAL PAPER denies that Plaintiff was injured or damaged at all by reason of any act or omission by it or its agents.

SIXTH: The allegations contained in Paragraphs 43 through 61 of the Complaint are directed at individuals or entities other than INTERNATIONAL PAPER, and therefore, no response is required. To the extent that a response is required, INTERNATIONAL PAPER lacks sufficient information to admit or deny the allegations set forth in Paragraphs 43 through 61 of the Complaint and therefore, denies same.

**SEVENTH:** Defendant denies the allegations in Paragraphs 62 through 69 of the Complaint. INTERNATIONAL PAPER COMPANY denies that Plaintiff was injured or damaged at all by reason of any act or omission by it or its agents.

### ANSWER TO THE FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION SOUNDING IN NEGLIGENCE

EIGHTH: Defendant repeats and re-alleges its previous denials and defenses contained in

its Answer to the Complaint as well as all denials and defenses set forth hereafter, as if fully set forth herein.

NINTH: Defendant denies the allegations in Paragraphs 71 through 78 of the Complaint, including all subparagraphs thereof. INTERNATIONAL PAPER COMPANY denies that Plaintiff was injured or damaged at all by reason of any act or omission by it or its agents.

### ANSWER TO THE SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION SOUNDING IN BREACH OF WARRANTY

**TENTH:** Defendant repeats and re-alleges its previous denials and defenses contained in its Answer to the Complaint as well as all denials and defenses set forth hereafter, as if fully set forth herein.

**ELEVENTH:** Defendant denies the allegations in Paragraphs 80 through 83 of the Complaint. INTERNATIONAL PAPER COMPANY denies that Plaintiff was injured or damaged at all by reason of any act or omission by it or its agents.

### ANSWER TO THE THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION SOUNDING IN STRICT LIABILITY
