Introduction to Maintenance Processing

Introduction

The PM System supports the planning, processing and completion of maintenance tasks for the entire plant maintenance area. It provides a step-by-step explanation of the plant maintenance processes, thereby providing the basis for rational decision-making as regards cost-intensive installations, replacement investments and changes in maintenance strategies. It distributes up-to-date information on a regular basis to all the departments concerned.

The PM System supports the creation, planning, control and analysis of all the tasks which need to be carried out in maintenance areas. These include not only unplanned tasks or those caused by malfunction, but also maintenance and inspection tasks which are planned on a regular basis. Furthermore, the PM System can also map functions such as investments, reconstructions, retooling, which although they do not belong to plant maintenance itself, need to be processed using the same procedures.

Range of Functions

Maintenance processing in the PM System comprises several steps, which, however, do not necessarily all need to be performed in full. On the one hand, the wide range of functions available enables you to process a large-scale repair with numerous planning steps such as preliminary costing, work scheduling, staging, dispatching and permits. On the other hand, the flexibilty of the system allows you to react immediately in cases of damage and create the necessary orders and shop papers with a minimum number of entries in a short space of time.



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
