ORDER

Having considered the parties' supplemental claim construction briefs for "transmitting ... to a web page," the Court construes the term as set forth below.

"Transmitting ... to a web page" is defined to mean "causing the transmitted information to be reflected on a web page." The Court finds support for this definition in the intrinsic record, where the patentee used the term "[is] reflected instantaneously on ... a web page" to describe the transmission of information to a web page. '850 Patent, 4:21-23.

Within the disputed term, the parties also disagreed as to the meaning of "web page." The Court defines "web page" as "a document, with associated files for graphics, scripts, and other resources, accessible over the internet and viewable in a conventional web browser."
