As set forth in Petitioners’ detailed objections below, the majority of TT’s slides rely on evidence never cited or specifically addressed in any paper before the Board, do not properly cite their evidence, and/or present new arguments. Petitioners meet and conferred with TT regarding Petitioners’ objections on Monday, October 17, 2016.

Demonstrative Slides 3, 7-8, 11-18

Petitioners object to TT demonstrative slides 3, 7-8, 11-18, each in its entirety, because these slides do not cite to TT’s POR or any other paper in which TT advanced these arguments, and TT is improperly attempting to use this slide as an additional opportunity for briefing.

Demonstrative Slide 30

Petitioners object to TT demonstrative slide 30 because of the first bullet.

Copy of the objected-to portions:

- Román admits a user cannot distinguish his orders in TSE’s column 12

Petitioners object for the following reason: the first bullet mischaracterizes Mr. Román’s testimony (i.e., mischaracterizes the record).

In fact, even as late as 1998, Reuters, who was the assignee of the Silverman patent and implemented Silverman's Matching System in their GLOBEX system, did not implement the claimed combination and relied instead on a separate window for order entry: a conventional order entry ticket. *See infra* ¶¶ 80-89. 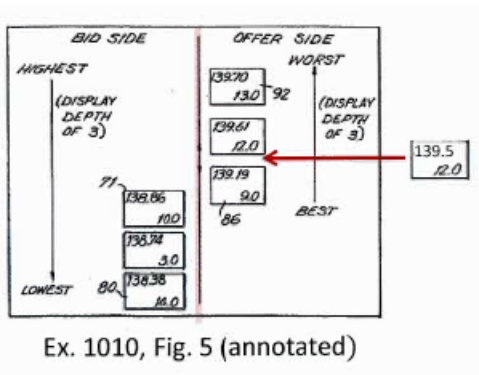
