2	JUDGE PETRAVICK: Please be seated. We're going to
3	take a minute to log into our computers.
4	We're here today for CMB2016-00054. I'm Judge
5	Petravick. With me on the right is Judge Medley, and on my
6	left is Judge Plenzler, in the flesh and blood this time
7	around, joining us from Detroit.
8	May I know who is here from the petitioner?
9	MR. SOKOHL: Yes, Your Honor. Robert Sokohl and
10	Richard Bemben from Sterne Kessler.
11	JUDGE PETRAVICK: Hello. And for patent owner?
12	MR. GANNON: Mike Gannon and my partner Leif
13	Sigmond.
14	JUDGE PETRAVICK: Hello, Mr. Gannon.
