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### **DETAILED ACTION**

1) This Office action addresses claims 26-42, 44, 45, and 53-61 of United States Patent Number 5,544,352 (hereinafter "Egger"), for which it has been determined in the Order Granting Ex Parte Reexamination (hereafter the "Order") mailed 8/2/2010 that a substantial new question of patentability was raised in the Request for *Ex Parte* reexamination filed on 5/24/2010 (hereafter the "Request"). Claims 26-42, 44, 45, and 53-61 are subject to reexamination. Claims 1-25, 43, and 46-52 are not subject to reexamination. Claim 45 has been cancelled.

2) This is a response to the amendment filed on 6/1/2011. Claims 26-42, 44, and 53-61 are confirmed/allowed below.

## Information Disclosure Statement

3) Where the IDS citations are submitted but not described, the examiner is only responsible for cursorily reviewing the references.
