

I. COMPLIANCE WITH REQUIREMENTS FOR A PETITION FOR INTER PARTES REVIEW

A. Certification the '682 Patent May Be Contested by Petitioner

Petitioner certifies that U.S. Patent No. 7,702,682 (the '682 patent) (Ex. 1001) is available for *inter partes* review.
