 - c: to demonstrate or suggest the necessity or advisability of <indicated the need for a new school> <the indicated treatment>
- 2: to state or express briefly < indicated a desire to cooperate>

Origin of INDICATE

Latin indicatus, past participle of indicare, from in- + dicare to proclaim, dedicate - more at DICTION

- 1 : to be a fairly certain symptom of : show the presence or existence of <the high fever *indicates* a serious condition>
- 2 : to call for especially as treatment for a particular condition <radical surgery is often *indicated* in advanced cancer>


