Claim Rejections - 35 USC § 102

Claims 126 and 128 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(b) as being clearly anticipated by Lysyj.

See covering 15, spring motor 30, rotating output 20 and one way brakes, each of Figs. 14 and 15, which permit free rotation of output 20 when the shade is being extended and which locks the output 20 against rotation to retract the shade. Regarding claim 128, see transmission 34,22, which interconnects the spring end with the output 20.

Claims 126 and 127 are rejected under 35 U.S.C. 102(b) as being clearly anticipated by Shaw.

See covering B, spring motor (mentioned in column 1), output A and one way brake E,F, which prevents rotation of output A in the extension direction, which is urged by weight C, but which permits the roller (output A) to "revolve freely" when the output is being rotated by the spring in the retraction direction.

Allowable Subject Matter

Claims 129-133 are objected to as being dependent upon a rejected base claim, but would be allowable if rewritten in independent form including all of the limitations of the base claim and any intervening claims.

Claims 113-116 are allowed.


Conclusion

However, since it has been indicated as being canceled in two places, page 2 and under "Remarks", it has been treated as if canceled. This action is not made final.
