JUDGMENT Termination of the Proceeding 37 C.F.R. § 42.73

On October 29, 2014, the parties filed a joint motion to terminate this proceeding, along with a true copy of their written settlement agreement, made in connection with the termination of the instant proceeding, in accordance with 35 U.S.C. § 317(b) and 37 C.F.R. § 42.74(b). Paper 18; Ex. 2006. The parties also

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filed a joint request to have their settlement agreement treated as confidential business information under 35 U.S.C. § 317(b) and 37 C.F.R. § 42.74(c). Paper 18.

The joint motion to terminate indicates that the settlement agreement requires the parties to terminate all disputes, including related matters and litigation involving U.S. Patent No. 7,145,710. *Id.* at 3–4.

The Board instituted trial on August 21, 2014. Paper 9. At this juncture of the proceeding, the Board does not have before it full briefing on the trial issues and the Board has not entered a final decision.

Based on the facts of this case, it is appropriate to enter judgment<sup>1</sup> without rendering a final written decision. *See* 35 U.S.C. § 317(a); 37 C.F.R. § 42.72.

It is

ORDERED that the joint motion to terminate IPR2014-00460 is *granted*; FURTHER ORDERED that the proceeding is *terminated*; and

FURTHER ORDERED that the parties' joint request that the settlement agreement be treated as business confidential information kept separate from the patent file, and made available only to Federal Government agencies on written request, or to any person on a showing of good cause, pursuant to 35 U.S.C. § 317(b) and 37 C.F.R. § 42.74(c), is *granted*.
