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to on this.

- And when they say a one-by-one tuck stitch, what does that refer to?
- One by one is usually referring to a knit. Α. So I'm not sure if they're talking about a knit. Maybe the tuck stitch has got elasticity in it so it would stretch. We don't know that.
- What do you mean by -- what does it mean by "1 by 1"? What does that refer to?
- Well, a knitted garment, like a T-shirt, is usually referred to as a one-by-one knit. You can have -- a rib would probably be two by two. you've got different types of terminology depending on what kind of knit the woven fabric is made from.
- For the ignorant, what is it about the knit 0. that makes it one by one instead of two by one or three by one?
- Well, you've probably -- you've seen yourself when you wear T-shirts, some of them stretch more than others. And I'm sure you've got a sweater that's made with a ribbing on the bottom, and you'll find that the ribbing holds better than the actual upper part, so the ribbing is a different type of knit. So you will find that, you know, there are different terminologies when it comes to

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- whether it's woven or knits.
- Q. Let's go back to Column 3 that -- where we were just reading about the tuck stitch because maybe we can understand some more. Actually, before I do that, this -- this exhibit here, Harder Deposition Exhibit 4, this is one of the documents that you reviewed in -- in preparing your declaration; correct?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. Okay. That's one of the documents you reviewed in preparing to give your opinion in this case?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. Okay. How much time did you spend reviewing this --
 - MR. LECHLEITER: Objection. Form.
- Q. BY MR. POLLACK: -- this particular exhibit, Deposition 4?
 - A. I can't recall.
 - O. More than an hour?
- A. I -- I don't know. I mean, we've had a number of conversations. I can't add it up.
 - Q. Okay. It could be less than an hour?
 - MR. LECHLEITER: Objection. Form.
 - THE WITNESS: I don't know at this stage. I'm

Q. BY MR. POLLACK: Okay. Going to Column 3 in Deposition Exhibit 4, line 38, it says there, "Thus, the 1x1 alternating tuck stitch pattern increases the modulus of the fabric. By increasing the modulus of the fabric, the fabric stretches less and controls more. Preferably, the modulus of the fabric is increased between about 6% and about 10%, more preferably about 8%. Increasing the modulus by about 8% provides a desirable compromise between control and comfort."

Did I -- did I read that correctly?

- A. Correct.
- Q. Okay. Having now read that section, does -- does that give you the information you need to understand whether or not the control area is expansible?
- A. I would say that the control area is expandible. I think it said it earlier on it would expand with the wearer.
 - Q. Uh-huh. Okay.

And let me ask you a further question, then. Is the control area expansible to cover and fit over a growing abdomen during different stages of pregnancy?

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 - A. I think it states in here that it would. But let me -- where are you referring back to?
 - Q. Column 3. This is the control area in the high-waist brief.
 - A. Okay. Can you tell me what your question is again?
 - MR. POLLACK: Court reporter, if you could repeat the question.

(Record was read by the Deposition Officer as follows:

"Q. Is the control area expansible to cover and fit over a growing abdomen during different stages of pregnancy?")

THE WITNESS: I couldn't tell you unless I saw it.
