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1 The reason we set up a call is that Samsung 2 would like to have an opportunity to file a short, you 3 know, maybe five-page response to the patent owner's preliminary response in both of the IPRs. And the 4 reason is as follows: in these two particular IPRs, the base reference that we've relied on to invalidate the claims is a draft specification from the IEEE. And we put in a declaration from a Mr. O'Hara who was on the 8 committee that was working on this standard. And in 10 the -- and he made certain statements that we were using 11 to show that this was a printed publication. 12 In the patent owner's preliminary response, 13 there really -- under the broad heading, there were two 14 things that were done that we would like to respond to.

The first is that they have accused certain of the things that Mr. O'Hara said as basically not being true. And in order to do so, they cite some evidence and we think that that evidence has been misconstrued, and we can go into details about it if you like. But generally speaking, there's certain allegations that they make referencing to documents that we think is inaccurate.

The second thing they've done is they have made a hearsay objection in a form that we think is not in accordance of the way that it should have been handled and we would like an opportunity to respond to that as

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
