6 JUDGE LEE: Hi, good afternoon. This is Judge
7 Lee. I have my colleagues on the line with me Judge
8 Busch and Judge -- can you hear me?

9 MS. REPORTER: Yes.

10 JUDGE LEE: Great. This should be a telephone
11 conference call for two IPRs: IPR 2014-00514 and IPR
12 2014-00515. Is that correct?

13 MR. MILLER: Yes, Your Honor.

14 JUDGE LEE: Thank you. I'm wondering if
15 either party arranged for a court reporter?

16 MR. MILLER: Yes, Samsung arranged for a court
17 reporter. I think she just announced herself.

18 JUDGE LEE: Okay, wonderful. So the caption
19 for both cases is Samsung vs. Rembrandt. And I think
20 the petitioner requested the call, so we would like to
21 have the petitioner begin, but right after we take a
22 role call and see who's representing whom.

23 MR. MILLER: This is Jeffrey Miller
24 representing Samsung and, I believe, my colleague, Dan
25 Cardy, the backup counsel in these cases is also on the

2 JUDGE LEE: Thank you.

3 MR. ENGELLENER: And this is Tom Engellenner
4 from Pepper Hamilton representing Rembrandt, and my
5 backup counsel Reza Mollaaghababa and Lana Gladstein
6 are here with me.

7 JUDGE LEE: Thank you.

8 Go ahead, Mr. Miller.

9 MR. MILLER: All right. Thank you --

10 MS. REPORTER: One second. I apologize, this
11 is the court reporter.

12 [Brief discussion]

13 JUDGE LEE: I'm Judge Lee, Jameson Lee. And
14 Samsung will be just Mr. Jeff Miller speaking; is that
15 right?

16 MR. MILLER: Unless I need some backup
17 assistance from Mr. Cardy, but yes, that's our plan.

18 JUDGE LEE: Okay. And for Rembrandt, the
19 person who will be --

20 MR. ENGELLENER: Yes, Tom Engellenner.

21 MS. REPORTER: Okay. Very good. Thank you
22 for that, Judge.

23 JUDGE LEE: Thank you.

24 Go ahead, Mr. Miller.

25 MR. MILLER: Thank you.

1 The reason we set up a call is that Samsung
2 would like to have an opportunity to file a short, you
3 know, maybe five-page response to the patent owner's
4 preliminary response in both of the IPRs. And the
5 reason is as follows: in these two particular IPRs, the
6 base reference that we've relied on to invalidate the
7 claims is a draft specification from the IEEE. And we
8 put in a declaration from a Mr. O'Hara who was on the
9 committee that was working on this standard. And in
10 the -- and he made certain statements that we were using
11 to show that this was a printed publication.

12 In the patent owner's preliminary response,
13 there really -- under the broad heading, there were two
14 things that were done that we would like to respond to.
15 The first is that they have accused certain of the
16 things that Mr. O'Hara said as basically not being true.
17 And in order to do so, they cite some evidence and we
18 think that that evidence has been misconstrued, and we
19 can go into details about it if you like. But generally
20 speaking, there's certain allegations that they make
21 referencing to documents that we think is inaccurate.

22 The second thing they've done is they have made
23 a hearsay objection in a form that we think is not in
24 accordance of the way that it should have been handled
25 and we would like an opportunity to respond to that as
