DECISION  
Motion for *Pro Hac Vice* Admission  
37 C.F.R. § 42.10

On February 18, 2015, Patent Owner filed motions for *pro hac vice* admission of William Peter Guarnieri. The motions are unopposed. Patent

Owner's motions are *granted*.

Upon consideration, Patent Owner has demonstrated that Mr. Guarnieri possesses sufficient legal and technical qualifications to represent Patent Owner in these proceedings, and the Board recognizes that there is a need for Patent Owner to have Mr. Guarnieri as back-up counsel. Accordingly, Patent Owner has established good cause for Mr. Guarnieri's admission. Mr. Guarnieri will be permitted to appear *pro hac vice* in the proceedings as back-up counsel only. *See* 37 C.F.R. § 42.10(c).

It is

ORDERED that Patent Owner's motion for *pro hac vice* admission of Mr. William Peter Guarnieri is *granted*;

FURTHER ORDERED that Mr. Guarnieri is authorized to represent Patent Owner as back-up counsel only;

FURTHER ORDERED that Patent Owner is to continue to have a registered practitioner represent Patent Owner as lead counsel for this proceeding; and

FURTHER ORDERED that Mr. Guarnieri is to comply with the Office Patent Trial Practice Guide and the Board's Rules of Practice for Trials, as set forth in Part 42 of Title 37, Code of Federal Regulations, and to be subject to the Office's disciplinary jurisdiction under 37 C.F.R. § 11.19(a) and the USPTO Rules of Professional Conduct set forth in 37 C.F.R. §§ 11.101 *et seq.*
