3 JUDGE YANG: Please be seated. We have a huge
4 crowd here. You all came for the community day, right?

5 So, welcome, everyone. We are here for consolidated
6 hearing in IPR2015-00643, 644, and 830, between Mylan
7 Pharmaceuticals and Patent Owner Yeda Research and
8 Development. The subject of these cases are U.S. patent numbers
9 8,232,250, 8,399,413, and 8,969,302. Another set of three cases,
10 IPR2015-01976, 1980, and 1981, challenging the same patents,
11 were filed by Amneal. We recently joined the Amneal petitions
12 with the respective Mylan petitions, and the parties have agreed
13 that Mylan will speak on behalf of both Petitioners.

14 As you can see today, we have Judge Hulse joining us
15 from the Silicon Valley office.

16 Judge Hulse, can you hear us okay?

17 JUDGE HULSE: Yes. I can hear you fine. Thanks.

18 JUDGE YANG: All right, thank you.

19 Now, Counsel, would you please introduce yourselves.
20 Let's start with Petitioner.

21 MR. ANSTAETT: Thank you, Your Honor. My name
22 is David Anstaett, I'm with the firm Perkins Coie, and we
23 represent the Petitioner Mylan Pharmaceuticals, and I will be
24 arguing on behalf of all of the Petitioners today. With me at

2 Mr. Russell will be helping me with demonstrative exhibits today.
3 And then we also have Jeff Guise from the firm of Wilson
4 Sonsini, who is lead counsel for Mylan.
