grammar : a word that joins together sentences, clauses, phrases, or words

: a situation in which two or more things happen at the same time or in the same place

Full Definition of CONJUNCTION

- 1 : the act or an instance of **conjoining** : the state of being **conjoined** : **COMBINATION** <working in **conjunction** with state and local authorities>
- 2 : occurrence together in time or space : **CONCURRENCE**
- 3 a : the apparent meeting or passing of two or more celestial bodies in the same degree of the zodiac
b : a configuration in which two celestial bodies have their least apparent separation
- 4 : an uninflected linguistic form that joins together sentences, clauses, phrases, or words
- 5 : a complex sentence in logic true if and only if each of its components is true — see **TRUTH TABLE**

— **con-junc-tion-al** | \-shnəl, -shə-nəl\ | **adjective**

— **con-junc-tion-al-ly** | **adverb**
