Company spokespersons say that this acquisition will enhance iPIX's offerings with a photo submission, management and distribution in addition to the iPIX virtual tour. PictureWorks Rimfire technology, real estate professionals will have the ability to instand easily enhance their property listings with additional photos.

"It's a simple "drag and drop" of images from any digital camera, scanner, CD or flo disk directly into the Rimfire Web page," says the spokesperson. "Rimfire automatic previews, resizes and formats the photos, saving time for the user."

The two companies have signed a definitive agreement in which iPIX will acquire PictureWorks in a stock-for-stock transaction valued at approximately \$175 million. will acquire all of the outstanding shares of PictureWorks stock in exchange for iPIX common stock. iPIX will issue 5,367,670 shares of iPIX common stock to the PictureWorks stockholders. The agreement provides that if the average closing price iPIX Common Stock is more than \$37.06, then the PictureWorks stockholders will re 4,668,106 shares of iPIX Common Stock, and if the average price of iPIX Common is less than \$27.39, then the PictureWorks stockholders will receive 6,240,981 shar iPIX Common Stock.

The merger is expected to close during March 2000.

Upon closing, this acquisition will position iPIX as the only "end-to-end provider of vaccontent solutions", says the company.
