

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This interim revision of the Guidelines includes a revised section on Hepatitis C Virus (HCV)/HIV Coinfection, with emphasis on considerations for use of antiretroviral (ARV) drugs in patients who also receive treatment for HCV infection. A new table ([Table 12](#)) provides clinicians with guidance on the concomitant use of HCV drugs and ARV drugs, with a focus on potential pharmacokinetic drug interactions.
