Political/Regulatory Timeline

▶ 1931: NYSE required marking short sales, no short sales on downticks

16 other U.S. exchanges followed by 1935.

▶ 1938: SEC adopts 10a-1 – strict uptick rule (binding at 1/8th tick size).

▶ 1939: SEC again allows shorting on zero-down ticks.

▶ 1963: Special SEC study of short selling.

▶ 1976: SEC rule proposal to suspend tick test, withdrawn 1980.

▶ 1991: House Report recommends tick test for Nasdaq.

▶ 1994: NASD Rule 3350 requires bid test for shorts.

▶ 1999: SEC concept release about potential repeal of 10a-1.

▶ 2003: Reg SHO proposed, adapted 2004, leads to 2-year experiment that removes tick test for some stocks.

▶ July 2007: Tick test repealed, new locate requirements.

▶ Sep 2008: Ban on naked shorting, shorting ban for "financials."

▶ Feb 2010: Alternative uptick rule on stocks with 10% drop in price in a day
