AFFIDAVIT OF Redacted


Redacted, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

1. I am the Vice President of Sales and Marketing for Redacted Redacted, an established distributor and reseller of mobile electronic devices and accessories. Redacted primary place of business is located at Redacted Redacted.
2. I am submitting this affidavit at the request of Yeoshua Sorias and Zilicon Accessories, LLC (“Zilicon”). I am familiar with the facts detailed below in this affidavit, and I make these statements from my personal knowledge.
3. Redacted has issued an initial purchase order (the “Order”) for 4,000 units of Zilicon’s “Squirrel” brand cellular phone battery-charging cases.
4. Redacted interest in the Squirrel charger-case stems from the unique technology embodied in the Squirrel charger-case—namely, the integration of a charger and A/C prongs that fold flat against a relatively thin cell-phone case that can remain securely connected to the phone while the phone is being operated (the “Squirrel Features”)—that serve to distinguish this product from other cellular phone battery cases that still require a separate charger to be used.
5. The presence of the Squirrel Features in a battery case, and the expectation that because of these features the Squirrel charger-case will be a successful product in the global mobile device accessories market, is the primary reason that Redacted decided to issue the Order to purchase 4,000 units from Zilicon.
