
6. I have not applied to appear pro hac vice before the Office in any other proceeding in the last three (3) years; and

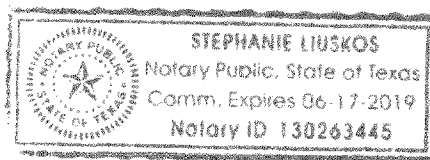
