As authorized by the Notices of Filing Date Accorded to the Petitions (IPR2016-00291, Paper 4; IPR2016-00292, Paper 4), Petitioner Toyota Motor Corporation filed Motions for *Pro Hac Vice* Admission of Mark A. Chapman (IPR2016-00291, Paper 9; IPR2016-00292, Paper 12).¹ Patent Owner Signal IP, Inc., did not file an opposition to these motions. Petitioner's Motions are *granted*. See 37 C.F.R. § 42.10(c); see also *Unified Patents, Inc. v. Parallel Iron, LLC*, IPR2013-00639, Order Authorizing Motion for *Pro Hac Vice* Admission, Paper 7 (Oct. 15, 2003) (setting forth requirements for *pro hac vice* admission).²

It is

ORDERED that Petitioner's Motions for *pro hac vice* admission are *granted*, and Mr. Chapman is authorized to represent Petitioner as back-up counsel in IPR2016-00291 and IPR2016-00292.

FURTHER ORDERED that Petitioner is to continue to have a registered practitioner as lead counsel in this *inter partes* review proceeding; and

FURTHER ORDERED that Mr. Chapman is to comply with the Office Patent Trial Practice Guide and the Board's Rules of Practice for Trials, as set forth in Title 37, Part 42 of the Code of Federal Regulations, and that Mr. Chapman is subject to the Office's disciplinary jurisdiction under 37 C.F.R. § 11.19(a), and the USPTO Rules of Professional Conduct set forth in 37 C.F.R. §§ 11.101 *et seq.*
