**procto-dae-um** \prə-'tə-'de-əm\ *n*, *pl* **-dae-um** \-'de-ə\ or **-dae-ums** [NL, fr. Gk *proktos* anus + *hodós* way — more at *CEDE*] (1878) : the posterior ectodermal part of the alimentary canal formed in the embryo by invagination of the outer body wall
