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1 PROCEEDINGS

2 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Please be seated.

3 Good morning, everyone. We are here for a final
4 hearing this morning in Samsung Electronics Co. versus UUSI,
5 LLC, doing business as Nartron. This is case IPR2016-00908.

6 Welcome, everyone. And let me introduce the
7 panel. I am Judge Giannetti. I will be presiding. And we
8 have two judges who will be participating remotely. On the
9 screen to my left is Judge Jivani, and participating via
10 audio is Judge DeFranco.

11 Let's start by getting appearances of counsel.

12 Petitioner, who is appearing today for you?

13 MR. MODI: Good morning, your Honors. Naveen Modi
14 from Paul Hastings on behalf of petitioner. With me I have
15 my colleagues Joe Palys and Chetan Bansal. Mr. Bansal will
16 be presenting the argument for Samsung today.

17 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Mister -- is it Bansal?

18 MR. MODI: Yes, sir.

19 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Okay. And he's admitted pro hac
20 or is he --

21 MR. MODI: He's -- he is admitted, your Honor.

22 JUDGE GIANNETTI: He's admitted.

1 MR. MODI: He has a registration number, so he is
2 admitted and he's listed as backup.

3 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Would you spell his name. It's
4 B-o-n-s-a-l?

5 MR. MODI: B-a-n-s-a-l.

6 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Okay. B-a-n-s-a-l. All right.
7 Mr. Bansal.

8 All right. And for patent owner who is appearing
9 today?

10 MS. SUMMERS: Good morning, your Honors. My name
11 is Teresa Summers. I'm with DGKIP Law and I represent the
12 patent owner UUSI. And with me at counsel table is Cecil
13 Key.

14 JUDGE GIANNETTI: Okay. Ms. Summers. I'm going
15 to switch chairs, if you'll just bear with me for a second.
16 All right. More comfortable.

17 All right. So, let me go over some details before
18 we get started. First of all, each side will have 45 minutes
19 to present its argument. The petitioner may reserve time for
20 rebuttal. Petitioner will start the argument. And the
21 rebuttal time, I think you can --

22 Petitioner, you can reserve that either at the

1 beginning of the argument or you can reserve the balance of
2 the time at the end of the argument. I'll leave that up to
3 you.

4 Let me say a word about demonstratives. Both
5 sides have submitted demonstratives, and I want to make it
6 clear that demonstratives are an aid to argument. They are
7 not part of the record of this proceeding. The official
8 record will be the transcript that the court reporter will
9 prepare and will be filed as part of the record in the
10 proceeding.

11 The transcript -- so, if you want something in the
12 record, make sure that it is on the transcript.

13 You are not authorized to file the demonstratives.
14 The panel will review them and, if necessary, at the
15 proceeding will authorize you to file the demonstratives.

16 One other matter with regard to demonstratives.
17 Since we have two judges appearing remotely, participating
18 remotely in our proceeding, when you do refer to your
19 demonstratives, please call out the slide number. They have
20 the demonstratives that you have provided us. They will be
21 able to follow along, but you have to call out the slide
22 number when you refer to your demonstratives. And I will try

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
