<b>Claim Term</b>	<b>Agreed Construction</b>
“hinge means for pivotally mounting the monitor to the leading end of the console housing”  (‘762: Claim 6)	Function:  pivotally mounting the monitor to the leading end of the console housing  Structures:  hinges, frictional hinges, and equivalents thereof

<b>U.S. Patent No. 6,678,892</b>	
<b>Claim Term</b>	<b>Agreed Construction</b>
“an interior surface of the vehicle”  (‘892: Claims 1, 25, 26)	“the interior roof, floor, wall, front portion (or combination thereof) of a vehicle”
“audio program”  (‘892: Claims 1, 25, 26)	The Parties agree that this term should be given its plain and ordinary meaning.  The Parties also agree that the left and a right audio channels from a single device do not constitute separate audio programs.

<b>U.S. Patent No. 7,050,124</b>	
<b>Claim Term</b>	<b>Agreed Construction</b>
“adjacent”  (‘124: Claims 38, 51)	Plaintiff JSI alleges that this term is indefinite.  If this term is not indefinite, then the Parties agree that the proper construction is “next to or near”
“media player”  (‘124: Claims 38,51)	“A device such as, but not limited to, videocassette Player (VCP), a digital video disk (DVD) player, a television tuner, a video game player, an A/V input jack, or a USB port, that is configured to read and play media from a source.”

<b>U.S. Patent No. 7,245,274</b>	
<b>Claim Term</b>	<b>Agreed Construction</b>
“internal headrest support structure”  (‘274: Claim 1)	“A support structure, all or a part of which is disposed inside a headrest.”

<b>U.S. Patent No. 7,839,355</b>	
<b>Claim Term</b>	<b>Agreed Construction</b>
“internal support structure”  (‘355: Claims 1, 14, 26, 38)	“A support structure (disposed in whole or in part) within a seat.”
