

You'll notice papers on Isotach Networks that relate to novel approaches to message delivery ordering in networks that brought me into contact with a lot of work with hardware and interfacing.

The Srinivasan paper, "Elastic time," we built special purpose hardware to support that. That was -- that's under the refereed journal publications. There would have been a number of conference publications in the same time frame where we were building special purpose hardware, working with SCSI devices, and so forth.
