ORDER

Patent Owner's Motion for *Pro Hac Vice* Admission of Jeanna Wacker

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Petitioner filed a Motion for Jeanna Wacker to appear *pro hac vice* in each of these proceedings. Paper 9. The Motion is supported by the Declaration of Jeanna Wacker.² Petitioner did not file any opposition.

The Board has reviewed the submissions and determined that the requirements of 37 C.F.R. § 42.10 have been met and there is good cause to admit Ms. Jeanna Wacker *pro hac vice* in this proceeding.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED that Petitioner's Motion for Jeanna Wacker to appear *pro hac vice* in this proceeding is granted;

FURTHER ORDERED that Ms. Jeanna Wacker is authorized to represent Patent Owner as back-up counsel only, and that Patent Owner is to continue to have a registered practitioner represent it as lead counsel;

FURTHER ORDERED that Ms. Jeanna Wacker shall comply with the Office Patent Trial Practice Guide and the Board's Rules of Practice for Trials, as set forth in Part 42 of 37 C.F.R.; and

FURTHER ORDERED that Ms. Jeanna Wacker shall be subject to the Office's disciplinary jurisdiction under 37 C.F.R. § 11.19(a) and the
