In their recent statements on the Korean Air Lines tragedy, senior Soviet officials have shocked the wor assertion of the right to shoot down innocent civilian airliners which accidently intrude into Soviet airspunder of 269 innocent victims, the Soviet Union is not prepared to recognize its obligations under interefrain from the use of force against civilian airliners. World opinion is united in its determination that tragedy must not be repeated. As a contribution to the achievement of this objective, the President has that the United States is prepared to make available to civilian aircraft the facilities of its Global Positi when it becomes operational in 1988. This system will provide civilian airliners three-dimensional posit information.

The United States delegation to the ICAO [International Civil Aviation Organization] Council meeting in the leadership of FAA Administrator J. Lynn Helms, is urgently examining all measures which the international civil aviation. The United States is preparant for this noble aim. We hope that the Soviet Union will at last recognize its responsibilities and join world in this effort.
