4	JUDGE BRADEN: Please be seated.
5	Judge Scanlon, Judge Melvin, are you both ready to
6	go?
7	JUDGE MELVIN: I am.
8	JUDGE SCANLON: Yes, I am.
9	JUDGE BRADEN: Very good. Court reporter, are you
10	ready to go?
11	THE COURT REPORTER: Yes, ma'am.
12	JUDGE BRADEN: Excellent. Good afternoon, everyone.
13	We're convened here today for oral arguments in IPR2018-00812,
14	which challenges U.S. Patent No. 8,856,539; as well as
15	CBM2018-00024, and CBM2018-00025, both of which challenge U.S.
16	Patent No. 8,577,813.
17	I am Judge Braden. Appearing remotely, as you can
18	see, are my colleagues Judge Melvin and Judge Scanlon. As
19	Judge Melvin and Scanlon are appearing via video, we require
20	counselor to speak directly into the microphone at the podium
21	when talking, and to identify specific slide numbers when
22	referring to the demonstratives.
23	Per the hearing order in these cases, each party has
24	90 minutes total time to argue their cases. Petitioner, Apple
25	Inc., has the ultimate burden of establishing unpatentability;

1 therefore, Petitioner will open the hearing by presenting its 2 case as presented in its petitions regarding the alleged 3 unpatentability of the challenged claims. Petitioner may 4 reserve rebuttal time, but no more than half of its total argument time. 5 Thereafter, Patent Owner, Universal Secure Registry, 6 LLC, will respond to Petitioner's arguments. Patent Owner may 7 reserve sur-rebuttal time of no more than half of its total 8 argument time to respond to Petitioner's rebuttal. Otherwise, 9 the parties may use their allotted time to discuss the three 10 cases and Patent Owner's pending motions to amend and to 11 strike in any order they choose. We ask, however, that you make it clear which case, 12 13 claims, or motions you are addressing. In order to ensure 14 clarity of record following the hearing, please provide the 15 court reporter with a list of names and word spellings; unless 16 you have already done so. 17 Lastly, we ask that the parties hold any objections 18 regarding a party's arguments until it is their time at the 19 podium. To be clear, we will not take objections during a 20 party's argument. You must wait until it is your time at the 21 podium to note any objections. I will maintain a clock; I 22 suggest you also maintain a clock. And I will inform the 23 parties when they have five minutes left. Let's go ahead and 24 get started with appearances for both sides. We will start 25 with Petitioner.

11	Secure Registry in present.
