The related civil action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Delaware, captioned *e-Numerate Solutions, Inc., and e-Numerate, LLC, v. Mattress Firm Holding Corp., Merrill Communications LLC, and Merrill Corp.,* No. 1:17-cv-00933, has been dismissed, as Patent Owner's infringement allegations are no more extensive than what is covered by the United States of America's authorization and consent.
