## Palm VII

The **Palm VII** was a **personal digital assistant** made by the **Palm Computing** division of **3Com**.<sup>[1][2]</sup> The device featured an antenna used for wireless data communication, a first for a Palm device. Connectivity was provided through the **Mobitex** network, under the now defunct **Palm.net** service. **Web Clipping** applications, also known as **Palm Query Applications (PQAs)** made use of the network to request and post web data. The devices also provided PQA developers with the user's position, in the form of a zipcode, making the **Palm VII** the first web-enabled **Location-Based Services** mobile platform. The cost of service was \$14.95 per month, and allowed a limited number of web pages to be viewed.<sup>[3]</sup>

The **Palm VII** was the most expensive Palm sold to date, with unit pricing starting at US\$599.<sup>[4]</sup> Despite the high price tag, the **Palm VII** proved popular as one of the first truly wireless data-capable information devices.
