## Palm VII

The **Palm VII** was a <u>personal digital assistant</u> made by the <u>Palm Computing</u> division of <u>3Com</u>.<sup>[1][2]</sup> The device featured an antenna used for wireless data communication, a first for a Palm device. Connectivity was provided through the <u>Mobitex</u> network, under the now defunct <u>Palm.net</u> service. Web Clipping applications, also known as Palm Query Applications (PQAs) made use of the network to request and post web data. The devices also provided PQA developers with the user's position, in the form of a zipcode, making the Palm VII the first web-enabled <u>Location-Based Services</u> mobile platform. The cost of service was \$14.95 per month, and allowed a limited number of web pages to be viewed.<sup>[3]</sup>

The Palm VII was the most expensive Palm sold to date, with unit pricing starting at US\$599.<sup>[4]</sup> Despite the high price tag, the Palm VII proved popular as one of the first truly wireless data-capable information devices.
