Stress. The symbol ('), as in mother (muth'or), and red' wine', marks primary stress; any syllable immediately followed by (') is pronounced with greater emphasis than syllables not marked('). The symbol ('), as used following the second syllables of grandmother (grand'muth'er), and ice' wa'ter, marks secondary stress; a syllable marked for secondary stress is pronounced with less emphasis than one marked (') but with more than those bearing no stress mark.


