



up with something trying or painfull. BEAR usu, implies the power to

BEAR usu, implies the power to sustain without flinching or breaking (forced to bear a tragic loss). Suffers often suggests acceptance or passivity rather than courage or patience in bearing (suffering many insults). ENDURE implies continuing firm or resolute through trials and difficulties (endured years of rejection). ABIDE suggests acceptance without resistance or protest (cannot abide their rudeness). TOLERATE suggests overcoming or successfully controlling an impulse to resist, avoid, or resent something injurious or distasteful (refused to tolerate such treatment). STAND emphasizes even more strongly the ability to bear without discomposure or flinching (unable to stand teasing).
