

I. P.R. 4-3(a) Agreed Claim Constructions

The Parties have not agreed on any constructions. However, the Parties agree that the terms that are not proposed for construction in Exhibit A do not require construction.

II. P.R. 4-3(b) Proposed Constructions for Terms in Dispute
