I'm writing to you as the CEO of Corephotonics – dual camera technology pioneer. Following Oded Melamed's recommendation, I want to understand **why our attempts to collaborate with Apple have failed?**

Corephotonics. 4 years ago we founded Corephotonics in order to commercialize the dual aperture camera concept. We have a clear technology and product roadmap (see below). Intellectual property. Our business model is IP licensing and we also deliver a lot of high quality design work in optics and cameras. We will be the first to invent, implement and demonstrate dual cameras which outperform the best single compact cameras. Thus, our IP opinion has the best defensive value for such applications. We will be very happy to discuss openly how to create the right IP.
