- 3. I have worked in the Intellectual Property Division of Sony Corporation of America since 2019 and had worked in the Legal Department of Sony Mobile Communications before that. My job responsibilities include overseeing patent disputes and in conjunction therewith the collection and review of factual and legal materials, including technical documents and relevant agreements, in light of such patent disputes.
- 4. I am informed that in U.S.I.T.C. Investigation No. 337-TA-1193,
 Complainant Neodron Ltd. accuses certain Sony smartphones (the "Sony Accused Products") of infringing certain of Neodron's Patents, including the '251 Patent.
- 5. Sony did not collaborate with either Apple Inc. or Microsoft Corp. in developing the accused features (i.e., touch recognition features) of the Sony Accused Products.
