2	JUDGE DROESCH: Good morning, my name is Judge Droesch, I am
3	joined by my colleagues Judge Boudreau and Judge Parvis. We are here for
4	the oral arguments for IPR2021-00375, IPR2021-00377, and IPR2021-
5	00582.
6	We're going to hear the oral argument for
7	IPR2021-00375 first. We'll follow up with a short break,
8	then, we'll hear the argument for IPR2021-00377, followed by
9	a short break, and then, the last the last argument for
10	IPR2021-00582.
11	I mentioned at this point that we'll take at
12	least five minutes' break between the hearings, and then,
13	if we're running ahead on time, we may be able to go a
14	little bit longer break.
15	So we can begin the hearing for IPR2021-00375.
