Why Inhale?

Pulmonary arterial hypertension (PAH) is high blood pressure in the arteries of the lungs. The symptoms of PAH may make activities like walking to the mailbox or walking up stairs difficult. As PAH progresses, it may become harder to carry out daily tasks.

Even if you're doing okay on your oral therapy, adding Tyvaso may help you improve.

Adding Tyvaso has been shown to help patients with PAH (WHO Group 1) already taking bosentan (an endothelin receptor antagonist [ERA]) or sildenafil (a phosphodiesterase-5 [PDE-5] inhibitor) improve their exercise ability by an average of 20 meters, as shown by their 6-minute walk distance (6MWD).

Tyvaso is an inhaled (breathed in) medication that can be scheduled around your daily activities.



Indication

Tyvaso is a prescription medicine used in adults to treat pulmonary arterial hypertension (PAH) (WHO Group 1), which is high blood pressure in the arteries of your lungs. Tyvaso can improve exercise ability in people who also take bosentan (an endothelin receptor antagonist) or sildenafil (a phosphodiesterase-5 inhibitor). The effects decrease over 4 hours; treatment timing can be adjusted for planned activities.

Studies establishing effectiveness included predominantly patients with NYHA Functional Class III symptoms and etiologies of idiopathic or heritable PAH (56%) or PAH associated with connective tissue diseases (13%).

- ⊗ If you have low blood pressure, Tyvaso may cause symptomatic hypotension (low blood pressure)
- ⊗ Because Tyvaso reduces the ability of your blood to clot (coagulate), it may increase your risk for bleeding if you are taking blood thinners (anticoagulants), such as warfarin or heparin

• What Is Tyvaso?

Tyvaso is a synthetic (man-made) form of prostacyclin called a prostacyclin analogue. Prostacyclin is a chemical made naturally by the body. People with PAH lack enough natural prostacyclin to keep the vessels of the lungs open and working properly.

Tyvaso is an inhaled medication, meaning it is breathed in through the mouth and directly into the lungs. The body. Tyvaso mimics some of the effects of natural prostacyclin, helping to open up the arteries in the lungs and make it easier for the heart to pump blood through them. In the clinical trial, patients who added Tyvaso to their oral therapy were able to increase their exercise ability by an average of 20 meters, as measured by their 6MWD.

Tyvaso is the only inhalable PAH treatment studied solely as an add-on therapy to be used with oral medications such as bosentan (an ERA) or sildenafil (a PDE-5 inhibitor). No therapy is without risk. Common side effects of Tyvaso include coughing, headache, and throat irritation and pain.

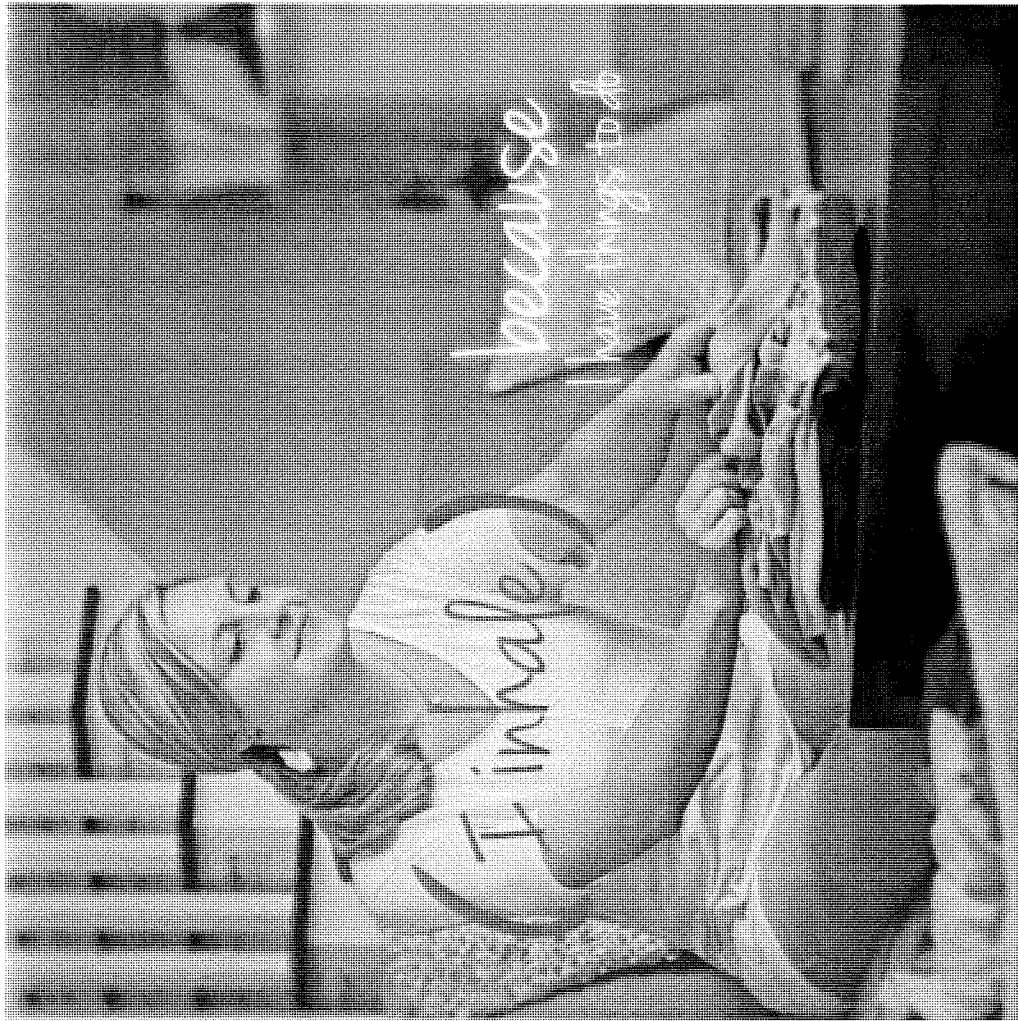
Selected Important Safety Information

Because Tyvaso reduces the ability of your blood to clot (coagulate), it may increase your risk for bleeding if you are taking blood thinners (anticoagulants), such as warfarin or heparin. The use of Tyvaso with diuretics (water pills), antihypertensives (medications used to treat high blood pressure/heart disease), or other vasodilators (medications that lower blood pressure) may increase your risk for hypotension (low blood pressure).

Why Add Tyvaso?

You may feel okay with oral PAH treatment alone, but could you improve by adding another treatment? Tyvaso has been shown to help patients with PAH who are already taking bosentan (an ERA) or sildenafil (a PDE-5 inhibitor) improve their exercise ability by an average of 20 meters, as measured by the 6MWD. This could mean improvement in your ability to take a short stroll in the neighborhood or walk your kids to the bus stop. Individual results may vary.

Make improvement the goal

It is important to work with your doctor to determine which treatment goals are right for you, and then develop a plan to help you work toward them. Physical symptoms may not always reflect whether PAH is progressing or how it is affecting the heart. Making sure you are meeting your treatment goals is one way to assess your progress. The 6MWD is one of several measures doctors use to determine how well you're doing and the effects of your PAH treatment.

Do you know what your 6MWD is?

Talk to your doctor and see if adding Tyvaso could help you go farther.

Selected Important Safety Information

Other medical conditions and medicines may affect your use of Tyvaso by increasing the risk of side effects or decreasing effectiveness. It is important to tell your doctor about your medical conditions and any medicines you may be taking, including:

- If you are taking gemfibrozil (for high cholesterol) or niacin (for infection), your Tyvaso dosage may need adjustment
- If you have liver or kidney problems, your ability to tolerate Tyvaso may be affected
- If you are pregnant, breast-feeding, or planning to become pregnant, talk with your healthcare provider about whether you should take Tyvaso
