3	JUDGE SCANLON: Okay. Good afternoon. Welcome
4	to the Patent Trial and Appeal Board. We're here today
5	for the hearing in IPR2021-00612, between Petitioner,
6	Bose Corporation, and Patent Owner, Koss Corporation.
7	The challenged patent is Patent number 10,206,025.
8	I'm Judge Scanlon, and joining me today are
9	Judge McKone and Judge Beamer.
10	Let's start with appearances. Who's here for
11	Petitioner, please?
12	MR. RADER: Thank you, Your Honor. My name is
13	Michael Rader, lead counsel for Petitioner, from Wolf
14	Greenfield. And also with me to argue part of the
15	hearing is my colleague, Nathan Speed, from Wolf
16	Greenfield.
17	JUDGE SCANLON: Okay. Thank you.
18	And for Patent Owner, please.
19	MR. KNEDEISEN: For Patent Owner, this is Mark
20	Knedeisen from K&L Gates.
21	JUDGE SCANLON: Okay. All right. Very good.
22	Thank you.
23	Because we're conducting this hearing by video,
24	please make every effort to speak clearly and to avoid
25	speaking over others. That will assist our court
26	reporter in making a clear record. Also, please try to



1	mute your line when you're not speaking, and try to
2	identify yourself when you do speak.
3	When referring to materials in your
4	demonstratives, it's helpful for you to provide us with
5	the page number for the slide that you're referring to.
6	That improves the clarity of the record. Or if you're
7	citing to other exhibits or papers in the record, you

17	Because it bears the burden of persuasion, Petitioner
18	will go first, and may reserve no more than half of its
19	time for rebuttal. Patent Owner will then have an
20	opportunity to respond, and may also reserve time for
21	sur-rebuttal. We will keep the time here to the best of
22	our ability, and I'll try to provide updates about
23	remaining time as the hearing progresses.
24	And with that, we'll start with Petitioner.

And please let us know how much time, if any, you would

like to reserve for rebuttal.

7	issues that relate to the independent claim, Claim 1,
8	and Mr. Speed will address issue related to the
9	dependent claims.

11	MR. RADER: If I could start Your Honors on
12	slide 6, please. I'm going to talk briefly about the
13	Rezvani-Rezvani-Skulley combination for Claim 1 and
14	Ground 1.
15	It's a very simple combination. Rezvani-446,
16	which includes this Fig. 7, describes a system, or an
17	ecosystem, including this WPM Server, which stands for
18	Wireless Portable Media, including music, and then, it
19	also includes various devices that connect to it
20	wirelessly including a headset and a handset. It does
21	not get into detail about the guts of the headset, but
22	Rezvani-875, which was filed on the same day by the same
23	inventors, plainly for use in the system because it
24	describes connecting to a music server. It discloses
25	the guts of the headset. It's all about the headset.
