CLINICAL ACTIVITIES

2006-2008 Co-Director, Johns Hopkins Transverse Myelitis Center

Expanded clinical and translational research programs of the Johns Hopkins Transverse Myelitis Center in partnership with Dr. Douglas Kerr. This was the first and only program dedicated to TM clinical care and research.

2007-2008 Director, Johns Hopkins Encephalitis Center

Founded the first clinical and translational research program dedicated to encephalitis at Johns Hopkins Hospital. This program focused on development of treatment and diagnosis algorithms for acute encephalitis patients.

2009-present Director, University of Texas Southwestern Transverse Myelitis and Neuromyelitis Optica Program

Upon recruitment to the University of Texas Southwestern Department of Neurology, Dr. Greenberg formalized the clinical and translational research programs focused on patients with TM and NMO. Patients with these rare disorders had previously received their care as part of the MS program at UT Southwestern. With the establishment of this program, patients from around the world travel to UT for clinical care and to take part in research endeavors.



In 2009 the pediatric demyelinating disease program was founded by Dr. Greenberg. Located at Childrens Hospital, this program cares for pediatric patients with multiple sclerosis, transverse myelitis, neuromyelitis optica, optic neuritis, acute disseminated encephalomyelitis and other immune mediated diseases of the CNS. The outpatient clinic provides multidisciplinary care to patients and families from around the country. Dr. Greenberg has coordinated a team of neurologists, neuropsychologists, physiatrists, physical therapists, occupational therapists, urologists, social workers, nurses and school liaisons.

2009-2013 Deputy-Director University of Texas Southwestern Multiple Sclerosis Program

Partnering with Dr. Elliot Frohman in 2009, Dr. Greenberg became the Deputy Director of the Multiple Sclerosis Program. Assisting in the administrative duties of the MS center, Dr. Greenberg worked to streamline the referral and appointment process, and expand data collection for clinical research endeavors.

2017-2022 Interim-Director University of Texas Southwestern Multiple Sclerosis/Neuroimmunology Program

Dr. Greenberg became the Interim Director of the Multiple Sclerosis Program after the departure of Dr. Frohman in 2017. Leading in the administrative, clinical, research and education duties of the MS center, Dr. Greenberg has worked to streamline the referral and appointment process, expand data collection for clinical research endeavors, oversee the fellowship and improve the quality of care.
