I. INTRODUCTION

Complainant NVIDIA Corporation (“NVIDIA”) filed a complaint on September 4, 2014 alleging a violation of Section 337 based on infringement of seven patents: (i) U.S. Patent No. 6,198,488 (“the '488 patent”); (ii) U.S. Patent No. 6,992,667 (“the '667 patent”); (iii) U.S. Patent No. 7,209,140 (“the '140 patent”); (iv) U.S. Patent No. 6,690,372 (“the '372 patent”); (v) U.S. Patent No. 7,038,685 (“the '685 patent”); (vi) U.S. Patent No. 7,015,913 (“the '913 patent”); and (vii) U.S. Patent No. 6,697,063 (“the '063 patent”).
