#### House Passes Package To Fight Drugs in Colombia

The House approved a \$12.7 billion emergency spending bill whose centerpiece commits the United States to train and equip Colombia's security forces to fight drug traffickers. The package also includes money for the Pentagon to pay for the peacekeeping mission in Kosovo and for disaster relief in the Carolinas.

#### Security Council in Washington

Senator Jesse Helms played host to fourteen foreign envoys and the American ambassador to the United Nations. The ambassadors emphasized that they were not paying an official visit as the Security Council. though they were not hesitant to offer pointed commentary on some positions held by Mr. Helms and others in the Republican-led Congress. #### **National Security Aide in China**

Samuel R. Berger completed two days of talks in Beijing, which were described by an American official as "serious and thoughtful" and aiding the recovery of relations between the two countries since their nadir last year, when NATO planes bombed China's Embassy in Belgrade, The dominant topic was Taiwan and new tensions following Chinese threats against the island and the election victory of an opposition candidate. Investigators in Rushojwa unearthed 81 bodies at the home of a doomsday cult member. The death toll since March 17 has now risen to at least 725, with at least 229 of them children.

#### Helmets for Italy Motorbikers

A new and, by Italian standards, draconian law requiring motorbike drivers to wear helmets took effect. Italy, where it is estimated that one in five people drives a motorcycle or a smaller motorbike, is the last nation in the European Union to pass a helmet law for motorbikes.
