3. The searches collected news sources combining the names "Operation Rescue" and "Randall Terry" (for all of the searches discussed herein using the name "Randall Terry" the variants "Randall A. Terry" and "Randy Terry" were also included).

4. More specifically, one search yielded 5,447 results that combined "Operation Rescue" and "Randall Terry" in the text for news sources in 1986 through December 6, 2006. The search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year are attached at Exhibit 3.

5. A second search combining the names "Operation Rescue" and "Randall Terry" with both names in the lead or first paragraph of the news source in 1986 through December 6, 2006 yielded 976 results. The search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year are attached at Exhibit 3.

6. A third search combining one of the words "founder" or "director" or "president" "spokesperson" or "spokesman" with the names "Operation Rescue" and "Randall Terry" with both of the names and one of the subject words all in the lead or first paragraph of the news source in 1986 through December 6, 2006 yielded 704 results. The search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year are attached at Exhibit 3.

7. A fourth search combining the names "Operation Rescue" and "Randall Terry" with both names in the headline of the news source in 1986 through December 6, 2006 yielded 9 results. The search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year are attached at Exhibit 3.

8. A fifth search combining the names "Randall Terry" and "Hinchey" in the text of news sources through July 22, 2010 yielded 135 results. A sixth search combining the two foregoing names with the name "Operation Rescue" in the text yielded 90 results. For these fifth and sixth searches, the search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year and by location are shown at Exhibit 4.

9. A seventh search combining the names "Randall Terry" and "Jim King" or "James King" in the text of news sources through July 22, 2010 yielded 185 results. A eighth search combining the foregoing names with the name "Operation Rescue" in the text yielded 59 results. For these seventh and eighth searches, the search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year and by location are shown at Exhibit 4.

10. A ninth search combining the names "Randall Terry" and "Schiavo" in the text of news sources through July 22, 2010 yielded 884 results. An tenth search combining the two foregoing names with the name "Operation Rescue" in the text yielded 331 results. For these ninth and tenth searches, the search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year and by location are shown at Exhibit 5.

11. An eleventh search combining the names "Randall Terry" and "Barnes & Noble" in the text of news sources through July 22, 2010 yielded 80 results. A twelfth search combining the foregoing names with the name "Operation Rescue" in the text yielded 65 results. For these eleventh and twelfth searches, the search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year and by location are shown at Exhibit 5.

12. A thirteenth search for just the wording "Randall Terry Live" in the text of news sources through July 22, 2010 yielded 60 results. A fourteenth search combining

"Randall Terry Live" with the name "Operation Rescue" in the text yielded 55 results. For these thirteenth and fourteenth searches, the search criteria, the number of results and a breakdown of those results by year and by location are shown at Exhibit 6.

13. A fifteenth search combining the names "Operation Rescue" and "Troy Newman" in the text of news sources from 1986 to December 6, 2006 yielded 22 results. The search criteria, the number of results, a breakdown by location, and the complete text of the articles are attached at Exhibit 7.

14. Attached at Exhibit 8 is a printout of excerpts from the 976 results from the above-mentioned second search.

Dr. Szostak was an AAAS Defense Policy Fellow, a Royal Norwegian Science and Technology Fellow at the University of Oslo, Norway, a United Nations Development Program Technology Consultant to India, and a visiting professor at the University of Calabria, Italy. She has won numerous academic and professional awards, holds six patents, has written four

books and authored articles for a wide range of technical and scientific journals.

Religious Voting Data Show Some Shift, Observers Say

Ever since George W. Bush won a second term two years ago by relying on the turnout of his religious conservative base, Democrats have been intent on siphoning off religious voters.

Some liberal religious advocates proclaimed yesterday that the Democratic sweep showed that their party had succeeded in closing what they called the God Gap. But the results are more mixed than that, according to experts who analyze trends among religious voters.

Defying predictions of widespread disillusionment, white evangelical and bornagain Christians did not desert Republican Congressional candidates and they did not stay home, nationwide exit polls show.

When it came to turnout, white evangelicals and born-again Christians made up about 24 percent of those who voted, compared with 23 percent in the 2004 election. And 70 percent of those white evangelical and born-again Christians voted for Republican Congressional candidates nationally, also little changed from the 72 percent who voted for such candidates in 2004.

But in some states, like Ohio and Pennsylvania, Democratic Senate candidates who intentionally tried to appeal to religious voters did succeed at winning back a significant percentage of Roman Catholics and white mainline Protestants.

Ted Strickland, the newly elected governor of Ohio, is a Methodist minister who spoke openly about his faith, and Bob Casey, the victor in Pennsylvania's Senate race, is a Catholic opposed to abortion. They also won over some less religiously active voters, those who attend church once a month or less.

"It looks like the white evangelical base of the Republican Party pretty much held firm," said John Green, a senior fellow with the Pew Forum on Religion and Public Life, said. "The white evangelicals did show up, and they did vote Republican."

"The biggest change appears to be in the states where the Democratic candidates made a real effort to attract these religious voters," Mr. Green said. "It seems to have paid off."

Never before in any election had the religious left been so organized and so active. They held rallies and passed out hundreds of thousands of voter guides, all with the message that religious conservatives' traditional agenda of opposition to abortion and same-sex marriage was too narrow. With the help of religious liberals, six states passed ballot initiatives calling for a raise in the minimum wage.

"This was a significant shift in the religious vote, where you see a reclaiming of the values debate," said Alexia Kelley, executive director of Catholics in Alliance for the Common Good, a liberal group formed after the last election to counter Catholic conservatives

In Ohio, voters elected all four state board of education candidates who opposed the teaching of intelligent design, and victories like that gave religious liberals cause to proclaim the end of the right's dominance of religious voters.

Bobby Clark, deputy director of ProgressNow, a liberal group in Colorado, said, "After 2004, people were saying that the religious right owns this country now. Far from it. They have networks and the ability to move quickly and to dominate the airwaves, but they do not represent most Americans. Most Americans are pretty moderate people."

In Colorado and seven other states, voters approved constitutional amendments defining marriage as a union between a man and a woman. Arizona was the only state in which such an amendment was defeated.

Yet religious conservatives were reeling yesterday. The Rev. Troy Newman, president of the anti-abortion OPERATION RESCUE, called Election Day Bloody Tuesday because of a string of defeats. Among them were a sweeping initiative in South Dakota that would have outlawed most abortions; a proposition in California that would have required parents to be notified when minors have abortions; and the attorney general in Kansas, Phill Kline, who has investigated abortion clinics.

Mr. Newman said that many religious leaders he knew had remained silent or had endorsed Democrats. "The pulpits of America bear responsibility," he said. "I believe God will hold them accountable for that."

The shifts in the Catholic vote were the most noteworthy. In Ohio, according to exit polls, Democrats picked up 20 percent more of that constituency than they had in 2000; in Pennsylvania, they picked up 11 percent more. The comparison is not exact, however, because 2000 involved a presidential election, not a midterm election. Data for the 2002 midterm election in those states are not available.

(Comparisons of evangelical voters are unreliable because exit poll questions designed to identify evangelicals changed from one election to another.)

The religious voters who did switch from Republican to Democrat just mirrored the American electorate as a whole, said James L. Guth, a professor of political science and adviser for the College Republicans at Furman University in Greenville, S.C.

Clinics want investigation - Bill O'Reilly's remarks over abortion records prompt the request

TOPEKA - Two abortion clinics asked the state's highest court Monday to investigate Attorney General Phill Kline and Fox television's Bill O'Reilly over O'Reilly's statements that he had obtained information from Kansas abortion records.

The request to the Supreme Court for a special prosecutor came a day before voters decided whether Kline, a strong abortion opponent, received a second term. Kline is in a bitter race with Democrat Paul Morrison, the Johnson County district attorney.

During a Wichita campaign stop, Kline called the request "frivolous." It came from Dr. George Tiller and his Wichita clinic and a clinic operated in Overland Park by Planned Parenthood of Kansas and Mid-Missouri.

O'Reilly said during his daily radio program Monday that Tiller "wants the guy that's going to let him off the hook to win" the attorney general's race.

"Despicable? Oh, God. It doesn't get worse," he told his listeners. "Does it get worse? No."

O'Reilly and Kline also took news organizations to task for not investigating Tiller more aggressively.

"I hold them accountable, the Kansas media," O'Reilly said during his radio show. "If they were as aggressive in attacking in Kline and me as they were in getting Tiller, Tiller couldn't operate."

The clinics' attorneys also asked the Supreme Court to seize the records of 90 patients from the two clinics. Kline obtained edited versions of those records Oct. 24 from a district court judge after a two-year legal battle with the clinics.

The Supreme Court's appointing a special prosecutor would be unprecedented. There is no record of the court ever appointing one before, spokesman Ron Keefover said.

The clinics' attorneys want O'Reilly investigated because they fear his information came from the records turned over to Kline. On Friday night's "The O'Reilly Factor," the host said an inside source gave information that Tiller performed late-term abortions because patients were depressed, which he called "executing babies."

Pedro Irigonegaray, a Topeka attorney representing the clinics, also called on Fox to fire O'Reilly.

"I think the attorney general's conduct has been shameful," he said after filing his documents with the court. "Mr. O'Reilly demonstrated callous disregard for women all over this country and his statements about the records were simply false."

It's the second time in six days that a Kline critic has sought an investigation of the attorney general. On Wednesday, former Attorney General Bob Stephan, a fellow Republican who broke with Kline, asked the state Governmental Ethics Commission to examine Kline's fundraising and activities involving churches.

Morrison has attacked Kline repeatedly for seeking the abortion clinics' records, saying Kline abused his authority and invaded patients' privacy.

Morrison campaign manager Mark Simpson said the latest development "doesn't really change what we think."

"Phill Kline has engaged in a serious violation privacy by seeking out those records and there are some serious questions about how he's handled them now that he's got them," Simpson said.

Abortion opponents rallied quickly to Kline's side. Kansans for Life accused Tiller of seeking a "personal prosecutor" in case Morrison doesn't win the election.

"There is no basis for such a motion before the Kansas Supreme Court," Kline said. "It is a political move."

Kline said he did not know what information O'Reilly has or where he got it. Asked if it came from someone within his office, he replied "absolutely not."

Troy Newman, president of the anti-abortion group OPERATION RESCUE, suggested O'Reilly's source was either a "scared" clinic employee or a woman who'd had an abortion and regretted it. He said OPERATION RESCUE has received information from both in the past.

IRS revokes tax-exempt status for anti-abortion OPERATION RESCUE

The Internal Revenue Service has revoked the tax-exempt status of the anti-abortion organization OPERATION RESCUE West for prohibited political activity during the 2004 election.

President Troy Newman said the Wichita, Kan., group, now known as OPERATION RESCUE, relinquished its charitable status and reorganized more than a year ago.

"We gave it back. We didn't fight any sort of deal," he said.

The laws that permit some organizations to organize as tax-exempt entities also bar them from participating in or intervening in elections, including advocating for or against any candidate.

The IRS revoked the group's tax-exempt status last week, and it was reported Friday by The New York Times.

The tax agency said earlier this year that it found violations in three of four churches, charities and other civic groups suspected of running afoul of restraints on political activity. It did not identify any of those organizations.

Most of those examinations found only a single, isolated incident of prohibited campaign activity. In a few cases, they found flagrant violations of the law.

IRS Commissioner Mark Everson called the amount of political intervention discovered through their examinations "disturbing" for the impact it could have on the integrity of churches and charities.

The examinations looked at only a tiny fraction of the more than 1 million taxexempt groups organized under section 501(c)(3) of the tax law.

Cockroach will continue to bug Governor Sebelius

Troy Newman of Towanda, leader of the anti-abortion organization OPERATION RESCUE, said his appearance Saturday in a cockroach costume at the gubernatorial debate in Hutchinson was meant as "political satire, for crying out loud."

"Who wasn't laughing?" Newman asked.

Democrat Gov. Kathleen Sebelius' backers weren't laughing as Newman and another man wearing a cockroach outfit performed antics during the debate.

One man allegedly pulled Newman's mask, causing a skin injury that required rubbing alcohol and a Band-Aid, according to Newman.

Newman said Saturday that the cockroach protest would continue at other Sebelius debates leading up to the Nov. 7 general election.

"We're actually thinking about filing for a temporary restraining order, barring the Sebelius campaign from any further acts of violence," Newman said.

The Kansas Highway Patrol wrote two reports from the incident after talking to Newman and the man that allegedly caused the injury. The Highway Patrol forwarded the reports to Reno County District Attorney Keith Schroeder for possible action.

Neither the Highway Patrol nor Schroeder would release the names of the people involved because no charges have been filed.

Schroeder said he was assigning the case to Assistant District Attorney Karen Smart, and she will be participating in a jury trial starting Tuesday. If she doesn't get to it before the end of this week, there could be a delay because Schroeder wants to review the matter and he will be out of the office much of next week. He will return to the office Sept. 22.

"A slight amount of injury will usually constitute a misdemeanor battery, but a lot of it depends on the manner in which that injury was inflicted," Schroeder said.

OPERATION RESCUE bought a former abortion clinic in Wichita, and Newman said they found cockroaches and mouse droppings. He criticized Sebelius' veto of legislation requiring inspections of clinics.

Facetiously, the "cockroaches" declared they love Sebelius and are her campaign mascot.

Newman is critical, too, of Sebelius' challenger, State Sen. Jim Barnett, R-Emporia, for not pressing the abortion issue in his campaign.

Abortion foes to turn former Wichita clinic into offices

WICHITA - It was 1991, at the height of the Summer of Mercy protests in Wichita that drew thousands of anti-abortion demonstrators to this city.

Jeff White, OPERATION RESCUE's tactical director at that time, was among the 80 pastors arrested at the Central Women's Services here in one of the largest civil disobedience demonstrations anywhere in the burgeoning anti-abortion movement.

It would take another generation and 15 years before his daughter, Allison White, bought the building leased by the Wichita abortion clinic.

On Thursday, OPERATION RESCUE director **Troy Newman** disclosed that White was the unknown third party who helped the anti-abortion group buy the building housing the embattled clinic. The facility now will house a memorial and the group's national headquarters.

"This place represented human tragedy, but it is being redeemed in the name of the Lord," Newman said. "A place that was a broken vessel - a disgusting, filthy building - is now going to be renovated and redeemed and used for righteousness' sake."

Abortion foes present petition for grand jury

WICHITA - Abortion opponents on Friday presented the Sedgwick County court with a petition bearing 7,754 local signatures, far more than needed to force a grand jury to investigate the case of a mentally retarded woman who died after having a late-term abortion.

The petition calls for a grand jury to look at the circumstances surrounding the death of Christin Gilbert, a 19-year-old woman whose family brought her to Dr. George Tiller's clinic in Wichita for an abortion in January 2005. If the signatures are found to be valid, a judge then determines whether the petition is in proper form and convenes a grand jury to decide whether to bring criminal charges.

"Today, we are taking a proactive approach. We are not going to take a defensive approach any longer," said <u>Troy Newman</u>, president of OPERATION RESCUE in Wichita. "This is a proactive measure to tell the city government, to tell the people in Topeka, to tell the governor that George Tiller is not above the law." Lee Thompson - who represents Tiller's clinic, Women's Health Care Services - told reporters Friday that a grand jury would be "a waste of public resources," adding that authorities have reviewed the case thoroughly already.

"We think that the attempt to convene a grand jury is a blatant publicity stunt by an extremist group that has absolutely no connection to the patient or to her family," Thompson said.

Last year, the Kansas Board of Healing Arts cleared Tiller in Gilbert's death. While an autopsy listed complications from the abortion as the cause of death, the board concluded neither Tiller nor his staff was responsible.

The grand jury petition represents the latest tactic used by anti-abortion activists in Kansas, which has become a major battleground because Tiller is one of the few doctors in the U.S. who performs late-term abortions.

Tiller's clinic has been the target of protests for years. His clinic was bombed in 1985, and he was shot by a protester in 1993.

Abortion foes are invoking a 1970 Kansas law that allows citizens to call for a grand jury investigation if they believe local law enforcement agencies have failed to act. Kansas is one of the few states with such a law.

Under the law, a grand jury may be summoned within 60 days after a petition is presented bearing the signatures of slightly more than 2 percent of a county's voters.

Pornography opponents used the law in Wichita last year to get an indictment against a store selling adult sexual materials.

Abortion foes want to see Tiller charged with such offenses as involuntary manslaughter, mistreatment of a dependent adult, and failure to report abuse of a child. They contend the woman, who had Down syndrome, did not have the mental capacity to consent to either the sex or the abortion.

Gilbert was 28 weeks pregnant when her parents took her to the Wichita clinic for the abortion. Three days later she died from an infection. Activists contend proper medical monitoring of the woman's condition should have found the infection and her worsening condition.

At a ceremony in front of the county courthouse Friday, activists played a 911 call made from the clinic in which a woman caller evades questions from dispatchers about the nature of the emergency and asks them to send an ambulance without sirens or lights.

A video that included a picture gallery of Gilbert's life was played on a big-screen television that had been loaded behind a van. Newman asked supporters to pray that a

judge appoint an independent prosecutor rather than the local district attorney's office to look into the case.

COURT BACKS ABORTION PROTESTERS

WASHINGTON - A 20-year-old legal fight over protests outside abortion clinics ended Tuesday with the Supreme Court ruling that federal extortion and racketeering laws cannot be used against demonstrators.

"We're jubilant," said Troy Newman, president of OPERATION RESCUE. "The pro-life movement just couldn't be more energized at this moment in history."

Newman said the ruling will bring more people out to demonstrations at clinics like George Tiller's in Wichita. But he denied it would lead to more violence at the demonstrations.

"One thing OPERATION RESCUE has stood for is peaceful intervention on behalf of the children," Newman said.

But Julie Burkhart, executive director and president of ProKanDo, Tiller's political action committee, said the court's ruling and South Dakota's recently passed abortion ban would fuel an increase in violence at clinics by anti-abortion extremists.

She said she hadn't talked to Tiller's or any other clinic about the ruling, but added, "I would expect clinics would be increasing their security."

The effect of Tuesday's ruling will be limited because a federal law enacted in 1994 makes it illegal to block the entrances to an abortion clinic.

The legal battle began during an era of abortion clinic bombings in the 1980s. At the same time, anti-abortion groups such as OPERATION RESCUE employed human blockades to try to stop pregnant patients from entering clinics.

Searching for a legal weapon to combat such tactics, the National Organiza tion for Women sued OPERATION RESCUE and its leaders for violating the federal antiracketeering law. This law incorporates other federal measures, including the laws against robbery and extortion. The Supreme Court allowed this suit to go forward in 1994, and a jury in Chicago ruled that the protesters had used force and, on occasion, violence to prevent patients and staff from entering clinics. A judge assessed damages against OPERATION RESCUE and issued a nationwide order forbidding its members from blocking clinics.

Three years ago, the Supreme Court appeared to reverse course. It ruled that the protesters did not engage in extortion when they blocked clinics because they were not seeking to take over these businesses.

The justices sent the case back to Chicago, assuming it was over. But a U.S. appeals court there said that because violence was used on several occasions, the lawsuit could continue.

In Tuesday's ruling, the justices said they meant to end the case entirely. Because the protesters had not engaged in extortion, they did not violate the anti-racketeering law in the first place.

While the lawsuit was languishing in the lower courts, Congress passed the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act of 1994. It makes it a crime to block health clinics, and it also permits clinic operators to sue if their rights under the law are violated.

NOW president Kim Gandy said the clinic access act is problematic because it requires abortion providers to seek injunctions city by city and turns back the clock to the late 1980s, when NOW played cat and mouse with OPERATION RESCUE in trying to anticipate the cities and clinics that abortion protesters planned to target next.

Newman said his group and others have set their sights on the clinic access law, filing legal challenges they hope will lead courts to overturn it.

Court battle turns into a battle of democracy

Minutes after President Bush announced he had nominated Judge Samuel Alito for the Supreme Court, discussion of the candidate's confirmation prospects centered on one question: Would he overturn Roe vs. Wade?

The centrality of this question--the "litmus test" as some have called it--appears to be of equal concern to both the left and right. OPERATION RESCUE's President **Troy Newman** "trusts" that "we are now on the fast-track to derailing Roe v. Wade as the law of the land," and Kim Gandy, president of the National Organization for Women, says that women's rights activists are "ready for a fight."

Those on the left think that publicizing the threat of women losing their right to choose is the best way to get Americans to rouse themselves from their torpor and rebel. I've received several impassioned calls from women's organizations to donate money for the impending battle, as well as a petition from the political action group MoveOn aimed at gathering half a million signatures to protest the nomination.

This approach to Alito's confirmation, however, couldn't be more misguided.

The more the left talks about Alito and abortion, the more it falls prey to the conservatives' strategy. Those on the right want the debate about Alito to focus on abortion to obscure the more important question: Why it is that Americans no longer trust that members of the Supreme Court will do their job? Justices aren't supposed to do the work of the party in power. That's why they're appointed for life.

Oh, sure, I signed the petition. I am astonished by Alito's dissent in the 1991 case of Planned Parenthood vs. Casey, in which he argued against the majority, and eventually the Supreme Court itself, in asserting that women should be required to notify their husbands before they can get an abortion. I think this conservative Catholic man is almost certainly opposed to abortion as an individual, and will uphold and foster the right's strategy of chipping away at women's access to abortion until it is almost exclusively a privilege of the affluent. Everyone should be concerned about the upcoming case of Ayotte vs. Planned Parenthood of Northern New England, which challenges a New Hampshire parental notification law because it does not contain an exception to protect the health of the mother. The verdict in the case will set an important precedent for abortion law, potentially increasing its restrictions.

But the fact is that the majority of Americans support abortion rights. According to the Pew Research Center, 65 percent of Americans think Roe vs. Wade should remain the law of the land, even if the idea of abortion makes them uncomfortable. A poll conducted Oct. 31-Nov. 2 by The Washington Post and ABC came up with exactly the same statistic: 64 percent said that if Roe vs. Wade came before Alito, they would want him to uphold it.

The right needs abortion in order to whip its base into a frenzy, and the public won't stand for abortion to become outlawed. The right relies on this stalemate to fuel the

culture war--when the Bush administration finds itself in a pickle, it trots out leaders of the Christian evangelical movement, such as Pat Robertson or James Dobson or Gary Bauer, to change the subject. It's an old trick. And the fact it has been overused should make the left more cautious in its attempts to use abortion to fuel opposition to Alito. Accustomed to the high pitch of contemporary politics, the public is likely to respond to the left's "emergency warnings" with a yawn.

The left needs to focus on the much greater significance of Alito's nomination: the right's astounding success in convincing the public that the judiciary is not supposed to be a non-partisan counter to the other two branches of government, but is instead just another realm of political access. According to CBS News, 54 percent of respondents to an Oct. 31-Nov. 1 poll believe the Senate should consider a nominee's "positions on issues" in evaluating a candidate for the Supreme Court. Only 35 percent believe a candidate should be evaluated on his or her legal qualifications.

No one, on either the left or the right, is contesting the idea that the Supreme Court is politically biased. There's a tacit agreement between the two parties that because Bush won the last election, and because two members of the Supreme Court happened to retire on his watch, the conservatives won a bonus: the chance to mold the law for decades.

The fact that conservatives are willing to risk a Democratic filibuster, which willcompromise or completely undermine their second-term agenda, or worse, alter years of Senate protocol by voting for the nuclear option in order to secure the place of a radical conservative on the court, should be seen as an appalling subversion of justice, not politics as usual.

The deep cynicism of the public, reflected in the fact that it no longer expects justice from those who sit on the highest court, is more likely to result in apathy than protest. Americans believe that money and power buy access, that representation is a utopian dream, and that citizenship no longer entails responsibility. Those on the left need to talk about the fact that the nomination of Alito isn't about choice, it's about a cavalier approach to democracy itself.

Bush selects longtime aide for High Court

WASHINGTON - President Bush nominated White House counsel Harriet Miers to the Supreme Court on Monday, turning to a lawyer who has never been a judge to replace Sandra Day O'Connor and help reshape the nation's judiciary. "She has devoted her life to the rule of law and the cause of justice," Bush said as his first Supreme Court pick, Chief Justice John Roberts, took the bench for the first time just a few blocks from the White House. If confirmed by the Republican-controlled Senate, Miers, 60, would join Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg as the second woman on the nation's highest court and the third to serve there. Miers was the first woman to serve as president of the Texas State Bar and the Dallas Bar Association. Senate Majority Leader Bill Frist outlined a timetable calling for confirmation by Thanksgiving - a tight timetable by recent standards that allowed less than eight weeks for lawmakers to review her record, hold hearings and vote. Sen. Arlen Specter, R-Pa., chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, made no commitment, saying he wanted a thorough confirmation proceeding. O'Connor has been the court's majority maker in dozens of controversial cases in recent years, casting deciding votes that upheld the 1973 ruling that established the constitutional right to an abortion, sustaining affirmative action programs and limiting the application of the death penalty. Within hours of Bush's announcement in the Oval Office, Miers travelled to the Capitol to begin courtesy calls on the senators who will vote on her nomination. Frist, R-Tenn., was first on the list. His welcome was a statement in praise. "With this selection, the president has chosen another outstanding nominee to sit on our nation's highest court," it said. Senate Democratic Leader Harry Reid was complimentary, issuing a statement that said he likes Miers and adding "the Supreme Court would benefit from the addition of a justice who has real experience as a practicing lawyer."

At the same time, he said he looked forward to the "process which will help the American people learn more about Harriet Miers, and help the Senate determine whether she deserves a lifetime seat on the Supreme Court." Reid had personally recommended that Bush consider Miers for nomination, according to several sources familiar with the president's consultations with individual senators. Of equal importance as the White House maps its confirmation campaign is that the Nevada Democrat had warned Bush that the selection of any of several other contenders could trigger a bruising partisan struggle. Other Democrats sounded anything but conciliatory. "The president has selected a loyal political ally without a judicial record to sit on the highest court in the land," said Sen. Barbara Boxer, D-Calif. At the same time, Republican strategists who spoke on condition of anonymity said they would have to work hard to assure the support of some of the more conservative Republicans in the Senate, particularly on the issue of abortion. All 55 GOP senators v oted to confirm Roberts. Little is known publicly about Miers' position on abortion, an issue of surpassing importance to outside groups on both ends of the political spectrum. When delegates to a national American Bar Association convention adopted a position in favor of abortion rights in 1992, she worked as head of the Texas state bar to force a reconsideration of the issue by submitting it to a referendum by the 360,000-membership. "This issue has brought on tremendous divisiveness and loss of membership..." she said in early 1993. Miers, whom Bush called a trailblazer for women in the legal profession, said she was humbled by the nod. "If confirmed, I recognize I will have a tremendous responsibility to keep our judicial system strong and to help insure the court meets their obligations to strictly apply the laws and Constitution," she said. Whatever her credentials for the high court, Miers' loyalty to Bush - who once called her a pit bull in size 6 shoes - is above q!

uestion. When he first decided to run for governor in the early 1990s, he hired Miers to comb his background for anything derogatory that opponents might try to use to defeat him. Miers also introduced Bush to Alberto Gonzales, who served as Bush's counsel in Austin and later in Washington, before being named U.S. attorney general. During Bush's first term as governor, Gonzales used information turned up by Miers to persuade a local judge to excuse Bush from jury duty, a civic task that would have forced him to disclose his 1976 arrest for drunken driving in Maine. The incident was not divulged until the waning days of Bush's 2000 campaign for the White-House. Federal Election Commission records show Miers contributed \$1,000 to Bush when he first ran for the White House in 2000 and \$5,000 to the Bush-Cheney Recount Fund in the post-election struggle that finally sealed his victory over Al Gore. Ironically, she had donated \$1,000 to Gore a dozen years earlier, when he first sought the White House. There was little outright opposition to Miers i!

n the first few hours after her selection was announced - and what there was came from the most unyielding conservative anti-abortion groups. "It's not that we don't know anything, and the small pieces of information we do know are disappointing. For example, she's Southern Methodist, notoriously pro-abortion," said Troy Newman of Operation: Rescue. While House spokesman Scott McClellan said the president had seriously considered 12 to 15 contenders for the job. He said more than one Democratic senator had broached Miers' name to the president, but declined to identify them. The president, who met with Miers on four occasions during the past several weeks, offered the job to Miers Sunday night over dinner in the White House residence. Bush told Roberts in a phone call around 7 a.m. EDT and informed O'Connor in another call around 7:15 a.m. EDT, McClellan said. Eager to rebut any charges of cronyism, the White House produced statistics showing that 10 of the 34 Justices appointed since 1933 had worked for the president who picked them. Among t hem were the late Chief Justice William H. Rehnquist, first tapped for the court by Richard M. Nixon, and Byron White, whose president was John F. Kennedy. Formerly Bush's personal lawyer in Texas, Miers came with the president to the White House as his staff secretary, the person in charge of all the paperwork that crosses the Oval Office desk. Miers was promoted to deputy chief of staff in June 2003. As an attorney in Dallas, Miers became president in 1996 of Locke Purnell, Rain & Harrell a firm with more than 200 lawyers where she worked starting in 1972. After it merged a few years later, she became co-manager of Locke Liddell & Sapp. When Bush was governor of Texas, she represented him in a case involving a fishing house. In 1995, he appointed her to a six-year term on the Texas Lottery Commission.

She also served as a member-at-large on the Dallas City Council and in 1992 became the first woman president of the Texas State Bar. AP Political Writer Ron Fournier contributed to this story.Miers Section: NEWS

Filling pivotal seat will inspire attacks from left, right

WASHINGTON - The fight for Sandra Day O'Connor's swing seat on the U.S. Supreme Court probably will be an ugly one in which consensus and comity are all but impossible.

Her seat is the pivot point of a closely divided court. A more conservative replacement could change decisions on abortion rights, the place of religious expression in public life, and environmental regulation, all emotional flashpoints for the nation.

Second, religious conservatives as well as supporters of abortion rights demand a litmus test on abortion, a stance unheard-of in earlier nominations.

Finally, the contest is the first since the opinion-a-minute world of bloggers and the Internet have joined cable TV and talk radio in stirring the passions of both right and left. It is a political echo chamber that demands confrontation, not compromise, to keep people tuning in or contributing money.

"It will not be pretty," said Dennis Goldford, a political scientist at Drake University in Iowa, author of a recent book on the ways courts interpret the Constitution.

O'Connor's decision Friday surprised official Washington, which had been gearing up for the possible retirement of ailing Chief Justice William Rehnquist. That may come soon as well, but his departure would trade a conservative for a conservative, meaning little substantive change.

O'Connor was a swing vote, however. She sometimes sided with conservatives, sometimes with liberals. If President Bush follows through with his campaign promise to name someone in the purely conservative vein of Antonin Scalia or Clarence Thomas, the court would shift to the right.

Many Democrats urged Bush on Friday to consult them before making a pick. They said that Presidents Ronald Reagan and Bill Clinton did that, and then nominated candidates both parties could back. Their choices won broad support.

Bush aides said the president has consulted Sen. Harry Reid of Nevada, the Democratic leader in the Senate, and would speak with Sen. Patrick Leahy of Vermont, the senior Democrat on the Senate Judiciary Committee.

Christian conservatives insisted Friday that Bush nominate someone who would vote to restrict or outlaw abortion. They noted that they voted for him in large numbers in 2004 - the so-called values vote - and want their due.

"It is time to make good on those campaign promises, Mr. President," said **Troy** Newman, president of the anti-abortion group OPERATION RESCUE.

"You have been given a mandate to end abortion in our nation by the American people who cast their votes for you. You have been placed in power for such a time as this. Now it is time to fulfill your obligation to God and to those who elected you, and appoint a staunchly pro-life judge to the Supreme Court."

The Rev. Patrick Mahoney, director of the Christian Defense Coalition, said O'Connor's retirement was a chance to roll back abortion that shouldn't be missed.

"If she's gone, there is an opportunity to get a ban on partial-birth abortion," he said. "Now there may be an opportunity to make some inroads in the abortion debate."

The left insists on an abortion benchmark for any nominee from the opposite perspective.

"We can never let her be replaced by a justice who does not respect the right to privacy and Roe v. Wade," said Sen. John Kerry of Massachusetts.

The Center for Reproductive Rights also insisted that senators ask the eventual nominee how he or she would rule on cases involving abortion. "They need to vote with eyes wide open," said Nancy Northrup, the center's president.

From the left, liberal activist David Sirota sent out an e-mail Friday charging that Bush would nominate a "wild-eyed lunatic." NARAL Pro-Choice America, an abortion rights group, said "the battle over the future of the Supreme Court could be won or lost within the next two weeks," and sought contributions from \$50 to \$1,000.

From the right, C. Boyden Gray, a former White House counsel who leads a group that backs conservative judicial nominees, charged that liberals would attack almost any Bush nominee "in hysterical terms" in part because, he alleged, they are backed by the pornography industry. Another group, Progress for America, vows an \$18 million campaign to back a Bush nominee and seeks contributions ranging from \$100 to \$5,000.

ABORTION PROTESTER ARRESTED AT CLINIC

A leader from OPERATION RESCUE, a group that opposes abortion, was arrested Friday during a demonstration.

Troy Newman spent about six hours in Sedgwick County Jail after being accused of littering. He was released on a \$500 bond, according to jail records.

On Thursday and Friday, police also confiscated items - including dolls, blankets and a child's coat - that OPERATION RESCUE members had brought to the easement next to Women's Health Services on-East Kellogg, the clinic where George Tiller performs abortions.

The group's "truth trucks," which were parked across the street, were also ticketed.

Cheryl Sullenger, OPERATION RESCUE outreach coordinator, said police had never confiscated these items before.

"We're trying to work with the police," she said. "They're insisting that they're just enforcing the laws," but this was "beyond anything that's happened out here before."

Officers confiscated the items because it is against the law for anything other than crosses to be left on the easements, Lt. Jeff Easter said.

Police had noticed the items before, he said, but did not ask for their removal because they had not received any complaints.

But Tiller voiced concern about the items Thursday with police, Easter said.

"When there is a complaint of a city ordinance not being followed, we have to go with the law," he said.

Newman did not pick up dolls that were by the crosses, which would be considered littering, Easter said. He was arrested because he did not sign a criminal complaint form, which is similar to a ticket.

Police returned the child's coat they confiscated.

Sullenger said OPERATION RESCUE leaders planned to meet with police next week to discuss what happened Thursday and Friday.

ARE GRAPHIC PHOTOS OF ABORTION JUSTIFIED?

Troy Newman's defense of the photos of aborted fetuses on the large "moving billboards" missed the point that just because it may be legal to display the billboards, it doesn't necessarily mean that it is justified (" 'Truth truck' fights ignorance, apathy," Feb. 19 My View).

It may be legal to show the mutilated bodies of our dead soldiers to argue against war, but Americans are sensitive enough not to do so. It may be legal to show the broken bodies of our teenagers killed by drunken drivers to oppose drunkenness, but we do not dishonor them or their families by showing them. Greater religious and cultural values compel us to use restraint. OPERATION RESCUE should find appropriate ways to use its freedom of speech.

Mr. Newman asserted that the photos should be considered in the broader context of what he considers the "horrific nature of abortion." Actually, he is the one who has not considered the broader context of the many and varied human situations that prompt abortions, such as rape, incest or threat to the mother's physical and emotional wellbeing. He displays the photos out of the context of a professional medical setting where the aborted fetus is not "horrific" but part of a compassionate medical response. He forces the photos on the public, children and adults alike, without respecting the rights of parents to decide what their children should see.

In the proper context, abortions are not "horrific" but sometimes necessary because of the physical condition of the mother or the fetus. There is no justification for showing the abortion billboards out of context.

Abortion debate needs reason

Two groups stood in Saturday's chilly air protesting at the corner of Seventh Street and Central Avenue in Kansas City, Kan.

A clinic is there, one of several places in the Kansas City area where abortions are performed.

Mostly men, the groups stood on opposite street corners. At the most basic level, the two groups agree. Both call abortion what it is: the killing of unborn babies.

Their approaches, however, are polar opposite. Which will make all the difference in the future and is why shouting broke out Saturday.

One group uses relatively quiet, peaceful protests. They appear sane and reasoned, although they hold graphic posters of fetuses post-abortion. Not a good idea in a public area where children pass by.

The other group has ties, at least philosophically, to some of the most violent acts ever committed by the pro-life movement.

One man wore a baseball hat commemorating the life of Paul Hill, who was executed last year for murdering an abortion doctor and his bodyguard in 1994. Another protester had a banner saying "Kopp-popped," a reference to James Kopp, who shot and killed a doctor through the doctor's kitchen window.

Remember the human blockades of abortion clinics? The bombings at clinics? Increased prison time for such crimes stymied the extremist end of the pro-life movement in the mid-1990s.

But 2004 has been named "The Year of Rebuke." And Wichita has been named the "U.S. Abortion Capital," because of the late-term abortions done there by George Tiller, a doctor who in 1993 was shot by a protester.

Both the focus on Wichita and the slogans are the doings of <u>Troy Newman</u>, president of OPERATION RESCUE West. The Operation moved with Newman two years ago when he relocated to Wichita from California.

"We are not going away," Newman said Saturday after a day of protesting Tiller's clinic. "We are here to make abortion an unavoidable issue."

Fair warning. The increased protests last week were due to the 31st anniversary of Roe v. Wade.

Tiller, the Wichita doctor, eggs it on. His clinic had what was termed a "special event," by one worker there. Free first-trimester abortions were given Saturday for Medicaid patients.

Saturday wasn't the first time OPERATION RESCUE West supporters appeared in the Kansas City area. It is unlikely it will be the last.

Last fall, protesters tried a new tactic, picketing the neighborhood where an abortion doctor lives. Postcards were sent to the doctor's Leawood neighbors first.

Newman says it is time to "dismantle the infrastructure that keeps child-killing a viable business."

"Who fixes their air conditioner, who fixes the plumbing, who picks up the cash?" he asked. "We are going through a systematic campaign and going to their neighborhoods and begging them in the spirit of Christian love to go into another line of work."

Another tactic is the "Truth Truck," a moving signboard of bloody post-abortion fetuses. Four trucks travel the United States. One is headed for the Super Bowl. A fifth truck is being purchased.

This community has to become more involved. The best route would be sane debates and working to prevent unwanted pregnancies.

No hiding behind the terminology "pro-choice." Years ago the term became a way to separate yourself from the screamers who at times seemed more anti-women than they were anti-abortion.

But for someone to simply say they are pro-choice does not answer the most basic question, "Do you believe abortion is murder?"

Newman rightly pointed out the Midwest is conservative in part because it is reluctant to change. People here seem unwilling to take a stand or ruffle feathers. He also notes people's faith is often "imbedded and generational and cultural." Going to church is often as much a social outing as a religious statement.

But while Newman sees this as why people hesitate to join his ilk, it is also the reason extremist forms of the pro-life movement could flourish here.

Extreme views fester in the absence of thoughtful debate.

ABORTION FOES PLEDGE TO BLOCK 'DEADLY DEEDS'

Leaders of OPERATION RESCUE West vowed Thursday to use new "aggressive and active steps" in their campaign to fight abortion.

Speaking to a shivering crowd on the 31st anniversary of Roe v. Wade - the Supreme Court decision that led to legalized abortion - OPERATION RESCUE West director Troy Newman said his group would turn up the pressure on abortion providers and those who work for or do business with them.

He said the group plans to close down Women's Health Care Services, the clinic at 5101 E. Kellogg where George Tiller performs abortions.

"We will expose your deadly deeds," Newman said.

Among those who spoke at the rally was Cheryl Sullenger, championed by abortion opponents for her work in closing 19 clinics - and vilified by supporters of abortion access because she pleaded guilty to conspiring to bomb an abortion clinic and spent more than two years in federal prison.

Sullenger insisted she has had a change of heart and a change of attitude since her conviction. Supporters of access to legal abortions aren't ready to believe her.

Candy Krueger said "only time can tell" if Sullenger's claims of conversion are genuine.

"We'll have to wait to see how far they go with this," Krueger said.

Sullenger held up a placard of snapshots showing the 19 clinics she says have closed as a result of her work. It had a spot where she hopes to eventual ly put a photo of Tiller's clinic.

Sullenger said she has learned that legal, peaceful tactics "are much more effective" in combating abortion than violence or other illegal methods.

Her research uncovered "dirty little secrets" about clinic doctors who had their licenses revoked or closed their clinics out of embarrassment, Sullenger said. Those secrets included such things as botched abortions and activities that were unethical or illegal, she said.

Krueger, who supports abortion access, said she is grateful her daughters have never lived in a world where abortion was illegal and where birth control was not readily accessible.

"They don't have any experience of having to look for that (abortion) doctor in . . . somebody's basement," Krueger said.

Groups on both sides of the abortion debate also held observances in Topeka, including rallies on the south steps of the Capitol.

Newman said his group will go beyond what it has in the past by picketing politicians who support legalized abortion, and protesting at the homes of employees and businesses with connections to doctors who perform abortions.

Tiller's clinic will be the site of the next local abortion face-off. Tiller is offering free first-trimester abortions for Medicaid patients Saturday, and Newman said his group will hold a vigil there that day.

ABORTION FOES CELEBRATE NEW RULING - -- OPPONENTS OF ABORTION RALLY OUTSIDE GEORGE TILLER'S CLINIC TO PROTEST ABORTION - AND TO APPLAUD A RECENT SUPREME COURT DECISION.

More than two dozen anti-abortion activists gathered outside a Wichita abortion clinic Friday to celebrate this week's U.S. Supreme Court ruling that said federal racketeering and extortion laws cannot be applied to abortion protesters.

OPERATION RESCUE West director **Troy Newman**, who helped organize the gathering at Women's Health Care Services on East Kellogg, said he didn't think the ruling would change the group's tactics. But he said it would add momentum to an anti-abortion movement that is growing stronger.

"This is a huge moral victory for the pro-life movement," he said. "We're going to be able to come to the streets without the fear of reprisal."

The clinic is run by George Tiller, a Wichita physician who performs abortions.

In its ruling, the court said those who take part in coordinated efforts to close or disrupt clinics cannot be punished by laws designed to combat organized crime. In the

past, abortion protesters have faced penalties when cited under the Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act.

During the lunch-hour gathering, members of the anti-abortion group sang, prayed and tried to distribute literature to patients entering the clinic. A small group of counterdemonstrators who support abortion rights stood across the street and sometimes exchanged angry words with the anti-abortion group.

Among those on the anti-abortion side was Paula Hecker, who brought seven of her 10 children from Winfield to take part in the rally.

"The Supreme Court said people have a right to stand up and say, 'I'm for or against something,' "Hecker said. "I'm standing up against abortion. I'm celebrating my right to stand on this sidewalk."

Also taking part was Jennifer-Sperle, who spent 21/2 years in a federal prison on charges that she conspired to shut down two-abortion clinics in Virginia in the 1990s.

Sperle said the court's ruling was a boost for those whose beliefs prompt them to gather on sidewalks outside abortion clinics.

"I'm just happy we've got that right," she said.

Protests on abortion-law anniversary

WASHINGTON - Hundreds of activists on both sides of the abortion debate converged on the nation's capital yesterday to mark the 27th anniversary of the Roe vs. Wade decision with a weekend of vigils, marches and protests.

The weekend events were to lead up to tomorrow's annual March for Life rally and march up Constitution Avenue to the Capitol and the Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court made abortion legal on Jan. 22, 1973.

About 50 anti-abortion protesters, wearing T-shirts that read "Mr. Clinton Stop Killing Children" and "Abortion is Homicide," waited yesterday in freezing temperatures to tour the White House.

Protesters also gathered outside a downtown Planned Parenthood office less than five blocks from the White House.

"It's the same as always," said Anthony Sheehan, an anti-abortion activist from Alexandria, Va. "When they stop killing children, we'll stop showing up."

Jatrice Martel Gaiter, president and chief executive officer of Planned Parenthood of Metropolitan Washington, D.C., said she was "appalled that 27 years after Roe vs. Wade we are still having the same sidewalk debate."

"The decision to choose should be a decision a woman makes for herself," Gaiter said. "Abortion existed before Roe vs. Wade and will always exist."

The protests yesterday came a day after a federal judge in Washington, D.C., ordered seven abortion protesters, including the director of OPERATION RESCUE National, not to obstruct access to reproductive health-care clinics in the Washington, D.C., area.

The ruling from U.S. District Judge Gladys Kessler came in response to a lawsuit filed by the U.S. Justice Department in June 1998. The permanent injunction prohibits the defendants from coming within 20 feet of a reproductive-health facility within the Washington, D.C., area.

The lawsuit had alleged that the seven defendants, including Philip Benham, OPERATION RESCUE's director, and Patrick Mahoney, director of the Christian Defense Coalition, violated the Freedom of Clinic Entrances Act by obstructing entrances of an abortion clinic in January 1998.

Mahoney was among protesters outside the downtown abortion clinic yesterday. "Our presence here is to protect life, to say it is important," he said.

Troy Newman, a California man with OPERATION RESCUE West, angrily accused the judge of showing her "true colors" and promised to return to challenge the judge's order.

Abortion in 2000

2000 could be a pivotal year in the abortion debate. What's happening:

Supreme Court

The court will decide two controversial abortion cases:

Carhart vs. Stenberg, a case challenging Nebraska's law banning so-called partialbirth abortions. About half the states have banned the procedure. Some courts have struck down the bans, others have upheld them, prompting the high court to announce that it would settle the matter.

Hill et al. vs. Colorado, et al., a case challenging Colorado's law mandating that protesters stay at least 8 feet away from abortion patients entering or leaving clinics, unless granted permission. The court will determine whether that so-called "bubble" violates freedom of speech.

Congress is expected to vote on several abortion-related bills:

Child Custody Protection Act, which would prohibit taking a minor across state lines for an abortion if that circumvents the minor's home-state parental-involvement laws. That bill passed the House, but the Senate has yet to vote.

Unborn Victims of Violence Act, which would make it a federal crime to injure or kill a fetus while committing a crime. The bill has passed the House and awaits Senate action.

Partial Birth Abortion Ban Act, banning the controversial procedure. The Senate passed it, but the House has yet to vote. President Clinton has vetoed it twice previously.

Women and Children's Resources Act, which would fund crisis pregnancy centers. They help steer pregnant women away from abortion. Introduced but not voted on.

In the states

Idaho: Gov. Dirk Kempthorne has promised to sign a bill requiring parental consent for minor girls seeking abortions.

Virginia: Gov. James Gilmore is seeking a law requiring a 24-hour waiting period before a woman can obtain an abortion.

Missouri: Legislature will take up a bill that makes it a crime to sell fetal body parts.

Arizona: The Legislature is expected to take up parental-consent and waiting-period bills.

Nebraska: 10 lawmakers have sponsored a bill tightening the state's parentalnotification law, requiring notarized signature, mandating that minors be given pamphlets on the risk of abortion, and explicitly declaring that the state favors childbirth over abortion.

Kansas: The Legislature is holding hearings on a bill restricting partial-birth abortions to cases only when the mother's life or health is in danger, specifically abolishing mental-health exception for the procedure.

NEW ABORTION BATTLE - Foes seek ways to counter widespread access to drug

- - THE FDA approval of the RU-486 pill shifts the target of abortion-rights opponents from a relatively few clinics to doctors' offices across the country. It also creates the dilemma: how to keep the stigma alive? In politics, meanwhile, the issue moved to the forefront just weeks before national elections. By Hanna Rosin

WASHINGTON--Yesterday, the federal government handed American women a new option for obtaining an abortion, and in so doing transformed the political fight that has raged since the procedure was legalized in 1973.

Ever since Roe vs. Wade, anti-abortion activists have been able to aim protests at a finite number of abortion providers, concentrating on the clinics where about 1.3. million American women go each year to have their abortions.

But by dispersing abortion into homes and ordinary doctors' offices, the RU-486 pill changes the landscape, making those locations elusive, the targets anonymous.

Activists on both sides agreed that the pill will radically alter the tactics and countertactics that have become mainstays of abortion politics. But the greatest burden is on antiabortion groups to keep the stigma alive.

Within hours of the FDA's decision, the anti-abortion movement began searching for new, more sophisticated ways to convince women that taking the pill is not a routine procedure but an option as morally and politically loaded as having a surgical abortion.

"Right now the average ob/gyn will say, 'That's not my specialty' and refer you to the abortion clinic," said **Troy Newman** of OPERATION RESCUE West, a spinoff of the radical anti-abortion group known for organizing some of the most aggressive clinic protests. "But now any ob/gyn has to face the question, and that makes things more difficult for us."

Redoubling efforts

Newman and other anti-abortion protesters spent the day devising possible new databases, new pamphlets, new arguments. For Newman, it was just a question of redoubling their efforts. "We can just call every hospital, every ob/gyn and ask them: `If I am your patient, will you give me RU-486?' " said Newman. "Then we will treat them the exact same way we treat an abortion provider."

Others spoke of expanding their list of targets in new and creative ways, investigating the unnamed pharmaceutical company that manufactures the pill, the investors who paid for it, and perhaps even the FDA that approved it.

Some anti-abortion groups were thinking up ways to associate abortion and RU-486, to counter the argument that the new option is morally neutral.

At the American Life League, which considers itself an education provider, the Rev. Joseph Howard said they were thinking of starting something called "Initiative 21" to remind women that a heart starts beating at 21 days after conception, well within the time most women would take RU-486.

"You try to emphasize a different set of biological facts," he said. "Because what's the difference? RU-486 is a chemical procedure, abortion is a surgical procedure. That's the only distinction. You're still destroying an unborn life."

Many anti-abortion groups said they realize their hardest struggle will be to keep that scarlet letter affixed to a procedure many doctors and women are apt to find more palatable.

In surveys, women who have taken the pill in both the United States and Europe report feeling more comfortable with the procedure and less traumatized, exactly the feelings the anti-abortion groups want to prevent. "It's very private, so it removes some of the visibility, the harassment," said Susan Tew of the Allan Guttmacher Institute, which studies family planning. "And because it happens so early, it might make the procedure more socially acceptable for many people, more mainstream."

Doctors are also more comfortable with the procedure. In a 1998 study by the Kaiser Family Foundation, 45 percent of doctors said they were "very" or "somewhat" likely to prescribe mifepristone, as RU-486 is also known, once it was available. Only 3 percent of them had performed surgical abortions.

RU-486 also has the potential to build a broader consensus for abortion. In general, Americans are more likely to accept abortion if it's performed early; 61 percent said-they support abortions in the first trimester. RU-486, prescribed within the first seven weeks, is well within that window. Support drops dramatically in later weeks.

Restoring the shame

To restore the shame, anti-abortion groups plan to seize on some of these perceived advantages of RU-486 and turn them into personal crosses to bear. Because the average doctor can do the procedure himself and not just shift it to a colleague, the average doctor now is faced with a stark moral choice, said the Rev. Pat Mahoney of the anti-abortion group Christian Defense Coalition.

And because a woman has to take the pill and not let the doctor do the procedure, she too has to search her conscience.

"There are no more gray areas. This will separate the chaff from the wheat, the sheep from the goats," said Mahoney. "It will force every ob/gyn to ask himself: `Am I here to support life or kill it,' instead of referring that moral dilemma to someone else."

"And now women are personally culpable," he added. "They have to do it themselves. It personalizes the murder." Some also considered another option: replacing an emphasis on stigma with one on women's health, expressed in more soothing therapeutic tones. In its press releases, the National Right to Life Committee yesterday underscored the "intense trauma" to women, the uterine bleeding and the contractions, the emotional stress and loneliness, and offered "healing help."
