ORDER GRANTING DEFENDANT UBER TECHNOLOGIES, INC.'S MOTION TO STAY PENDING RESOLUTION OF STANDING ISSUE

Before the Court is Defendant Uber Technologies, Inc.'s ("Uber") Motion to Stay Pending Resolution of Standing Issue (the "Motion"). Having considered the Motion, the Court finds that the Motion should be and hereby is **GRANTED**. Accordingly, it is **ORDERED** that:

1. Uber may conduct discovery of AGIS consisting of five (5) interrogatories, ten (10) document requests, and a Rule 30(b)(6) deposition;



- 2. Uber may serve a third-party subpoena (covering documents and a deposition) to Microsoft Corporation;
- 3. Uber may seek discovery of Christopher R. Rice, including a deposition and five (5) document requests;
- 4. The proposed limited discovery regarding standing is to be completed within sixty (60) days of the date of this Order;
- 5. The following schedule of deadlines for the parties' subsequent briefing:

| 14 days after completion of discovery | Plaintiff files its opening brief on standing. |
|---------------------------------------|---|
| 14 days after filing of opening brief | Defendant files its responsive brief on standing. |
| 7 days after filing of response | Plaintiff files its reply brief (if needed). |
| 7 days after filing of reply | Defendant files its sur-reply (if needed). |

It is further **ORDERED** that the case is **STAYED** pending resolution of the standing issue and until further order from the Court.
