14 Q. All right, sir. You talked quite a bit about claim 1 of  
15 the '794 patent, during your direct examination, right, sir?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And I've got to be honest, this is a little bit like a  
18 logic or a word problem. Would you agree with me, sir?

19 A. I don't know if I agree with it exactly, but, yeah, I  
20 see what you're saying.

21 Q. There's a lot of different rules that you have to  
22 satisfy to meet this claim?

23 A. Yeah, these limitations set forth in the words of the  
24 claim.

25 Q. Okay. And I want to talk through with you some of the

1 requirements or, I think, rules of claim 1, if we could, okay  
2 sir?

3 A. Okay.

4 Q. All right.

5 MR. WISNIA: Your Honor, may I approach the paper  
6 there?

7 THE COURT: You may.

16 controls operation of function devices based on remaining  
17 capacity.

18 Is that readable from where you're sitting, sir?

19 A. Yes, it is.

20 Q. Okay. Good.

21 Can we also agree that there's a rule that there  
22 has to be two sets of devices?

23 A. You know, it looks like we're rewriting the claim, but I  
24 think I see what you mean. Yes, there's a set GA and a set  
25 GB.

1 Q. Okay. So two sets of devices, GA and GB.

2 All right. Can we agree that all devices in GA  
3 have to receive a power consumption reduction instruction?

4 A. Yes. Here, I'm reading that the controller sends a  
5 power consumption reduction instruction to each function  
6 device included in a set GA if NA is detected.

7 Q. So that means all of them, right? Each and every one of  
8 them that's in GA?

9 A. To each function device in the set GA, that would --  
10 that would mean to each in our set GA, yeah. What you're  
11 saying seems to express the same thing.

12 Q. Great. So we agree.

13 A. Okay. What were your words exactly, though?

14 Q. All devices in GA receive a power consumption reduction  
15 instruction.

16 A. Right. And I'm -- you know, just the limitation here  
17 reads: If any is detected. I'm just trying to keep the  
18 clause together. But I see what you're saying.

19 Q. Okay. So all devices in GA receive a power consumption  
20 reduction instruction.

21 All right. Cover your left eye and see if you can  
22 read that.

23 A. I believe I can, yes.

24 Q. Okay. Good.
